Virtual Exchange – Important Considerations	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - As your exchange program is conducted online only, we will not issue a Confirmation of Enrolment for Visa purposes. - You can select to study between 1 to 4 units during your virtual exchange program. - You can only select units that are only offered fully online – this includes both lectures and tutorials. - You may be required to attend live classes or tutorials, so we advise you check the time difference between your home country and Australia when selecting your units.
