Challenge: to facilitate communication and preservation of the Guarani Mbya language

Solution: development of a chatbot for WhatsApp that allows access to a Guarani Mbya translator with spelling checker, sentence translation, and pronunciation addition



Challenge: lack of internet access in Xingu for indigenous communities to report rights violations and environmental crimes

Solution: development of a communication network for the Munduruku people

Challenge: to reduce logistical and tax costs when transporting goods

Solution: optimizer that indicates the cheapest route for transporting goods based on logistics and taxation databases that affect this movement

Challenge: early diagnosis of precancerous skin lesions

Solution: mobile software capable of identifying a possible case of skin cancer from a lesion photo



Solution: support that allows better positioning of the patient in the tomograph, facilitating lesion localization and needle position

Undergraduate – Effective Problem-Solving (REP)



Challenge: to solve high rate of delays when unloading raw materials at the company's largest mortar factory

Solution: integration of software for controlling the arrival of trucks and creation of a dashboard for visualization and adjustments to delivery scheduling

Challenge: loss of customers from EnvioFácil, a service for delivering products purchased online

Solution: integration of EnvioFácil with the PagSeguro platform; creation of educational content for customers using the delivery service; implementation of partnerships with delivery companies in small neighborhoods

Challenge: prolonged bed release period after medical discharge

Solution: integration software for hospital's Voice and MV systems to address the lack of accuracy in discharge data




Social Innovation Sprint Session – Computer Science

Challenges in Heliópolis: scarce data on floods in the area; lack of connection between mothers who need to work and potential child caregivers; high turnover and dropout rates of teachers in community schools

Solution: WhatsApp bot that generates reports for the government based on photos and videos sent by the local population; an app that connects mothers and caregivers, with a evaluation system for service providers; a system that evaluates the movement of teachers among the different schools they teach at

Challenge: transparency analysis of the 27 state courts, based on compliance with the Access to Information Act

Finding: the North region, in the first position, and the Central-West, in the second one, show the best performances in terms of transparency. The Court of Paraíba ranks last

Challenge: using data from income transfer programs to reduce dropout rates in high school

Solution: simulator based on regional variables, that estimates the probability of dropout for each income bracket, grade, gender, or race, and the amount to be invested to prevent it

Coordination: Ricardo Paes de Barros



Doctoral Program

Challenge: understanding the impact of the 2013 regulatory change on gold acquisition in extraction areas of the Amazon

Finding: after the legislation change, the homicide rate in locations most exposed to illegal mining increased by 20%. Deregulation and lack of inspection were factors that increased violent conflicts

Challenge: analysis of nearly 500,000 cases to determine if tools such as plea bargaining, and leniency agreements increase efficiency in fighting these crimes

Finding: agreements have moderate effectiveness in controlling corruption







Insper offers various modalities of dual degree, which can be explored in partnership with other institutions.

- 1. **Double Degree:** Two degrees of the **SAME** academic level;
- 2. Progressive Degree: Two degrees of DIFFERENT academic levels
- **3. Fast Track:** Agreement that offers facilitated selection process.

Parallel Degree with UoL/LSE

In this Parallel Degree model, Insper has become a Recognized Teaching Center by the University of London (UoL), one of the few in Brazil!

Students in Business
Administration and Economics at Insper have the opportunity to earn two degrees simultaneously (Insper and UoL), obtaining the UoL degree without needing to leave Brazil.



Insper and ADEPT

Insper is a partner of the ADEPT program (The Alliance for Data, Evaluation and Policy Training), an initiative of J-PAL LAC aimed at expanding training in data analysis, public policy evaluation, and development economics.

Insper offers:

- Innovative programs: Insper integrate the DEDP MicroMasters program from MIT Economics into its Executive Education and M.Sc. in Public Policy (MPP).
- Flipped classroom methodology: Online content from MIT complemented by in-person sessions at Insper.



Collaborative research – University of Chicago

Production of cutting-edge research involving academics from Insper and the Becker-Friedman Institute, and development of a pipeline of early-career researchers trained in advanced economic research methods.

Predoctoral Research in Economics Program – University of Chicago

Aimed at undergraduate students or recent graduates from Insper interested in pursuing an academic career. This program, offered by the Becker-Friedman Institute, lasts for two years.

Summer Institute in Social Research Methods – University of Chicago

Holiday program that connects undergraduate students to the research activities of the Social Sciences Division of the University of Chicago.





Collaborative research – University of Illinois

Production of cutting-edge research involving faculty from Insper and the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign.

Summer Research Program – University of Illinois

Aimed at undergraduate students in Engineering and Computer Science, connecting them with the academic production at the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign.



NextGen Academic Pathways - Columbia University

Prepare undergraduate and recent graduates for academic careers in economics, finance, applied data science, and political science. Participants work as full-time research assistants alongside Columbia University faculty.



Digital Policy Leadership Program – University of St. Gallen

Lasting one year and open to students from all undergraduate programs, this program is focused on research activities and networking in the theme of digital policy.
