To nominate students, **partner institutions must contact globalme@lakeheadu.ca** to have access to the nomination form

While nominating, partner institutions must submit the following two supporting documents:

1. **English proficiency attestation letter and**
2. **Academic Transcript (in English)**

Shortly after being nominated, **students will receive an email** from Lakehead containing **instructions on how to complete the web-based application form through our OUAC online system**

Do **NOT** submit official English test score (IELTS, TOEFL, etc.)

A letter of attestation is all that is required for admission.

Accidentally uploading a student's English proficiency score that does not meet Lakehead's requirements may lead to the student being **inadmissible.**

Restricted Study Areas

Law, Nursing, and some Social Work and Education courses are restricted to inbound Global ME students. Students coming through bilateral partnerships are not permitted to take Masters or PhD level courses, with exceptions to selected partners.

Program, Course Load and Grading Structure

- Students can register up to a maximum of 5 courses per semester. A course that runs for one semester is worth 0.5 FCE (Full Course Equivalent) and consists of 36 lecture hours. Typically, a course that is 0.5 FCE = 6 ECTS = 3 AU (Example: 5 courses = 2.5 FCE = 30 ECTS)

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS, STUDENT FEES & PRICING

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA or Temporary Residence Visa (TRV))

STUDY DURATION UNDER 6 MONTHS:

Students who are citizens from **visa-exempt countries** who will be studying in Canada may be eligible to enter Canada with an eTA. More information can be found [here](#).

Students from **non-visa-exempt countries** may require a TRV in order to enter Canada. More information can be found [here](#).

STUDY DURATION OVER 6 MONTHS:

Students on a bilateral exchange agreement (tuition waiver) are permitted to study at Lakehead University for over 6 months. If you are studying in Canada for over 6 months you will require a Study Permit from the Government of Canada (information [here](#)) and you will be exempt from obtaining a Provincial Attestation Letter (PAL).^{*} Additional information [here](#).

^{*}Please note that Fee-Paying inbound students **do not** qualify for a PAL-exemption and are only permitted to stay for 1 semester.

HEALTH INSURANCE

Inbound exchange students will be automatically enrolled and billed for the mandatory health insurance plan (Guard.Me) for a rate of **\$1.95 CAD per day**. This will allow them to access medical services on and off-campus. Students will receive a digital copy of their Guard.Me health coverage by email prior to their arrival in Canada. For 1 semester students can expect to pay about \$234.00 CAD.

ANCILLARY FEES

- Ancillary fees^{*} vary depending on a student's selected campus
- Thunder Bay Campus: Approx. \$150.00 up to \$330.00
- Orillia Campus: Approx. \$67.00 up to \$240.00
NOTE: Students coming through National Student Exchange (NSE Consortium) will not be required to pay ancillary fees)
- For the 2025-2026 academic year, ancillary fees are currently under review and are subject to change
- Orientation & First Year Experience Fee: Approx. \$83.00 CAD
- All fees are subject to change without notice

COST OF LIVING

ACCOMMODATIONS & MEAL PLAN:

- Approximately \$6,000.00-\$6,500.00 CAD per semester

COURSES TEXTBOOKS:

- About \$50.00-\$100.00 CAD per course

LABS, VISUAL ART SUPPLIES:

- Fees vary depending on your courses

GROCERIES:

- If a student is not on a meal plan, you can plan for approximately \$300.00 CAD per month

LAUNDRY:

- \$5.50 CAD per wash and dry cycle

- Orillia: approx. \$155.00 CAD
