NOMINATION & APPLICATION PROCEDURES

Nomination	Partner institutions must submit the nominated students information (Name, E-mail Address, Academic Program) to studyabroad@lakeheadu.ca .
Application	Shortly after being nominated, students will receive an email from us containing instructions on how to complete the web-based application form through our OUAC online system.
Supporting Documents	Along with completing the application form, students must upload the following supporting documents: 1) <i>English Proficiency Attestation Letter</i> 2) <i>Academic Transcripts</i>

Restricted Study Areas	Law, Medicine, Nursing, and some Social Work and Education courses.
Course Load	Students can register up to a maximum of 5 courses per semester. A course that runs for one semester is worth 0.5 FCE (Full Credit Equivalent) and consists of 36 lecture hours. Typically, 0.5 FCE = 6 ECTS. (<i>Example: 5 courses = 2.5 FCE = 30 ECTS</i>).

VISA REQUIREMENTS

Visa & Study Permit Requirements	Students from visa-exempt countries who will be studying in Canada for under 6 months may be eligible to enter Canada with an eTA. More information can be found here . Students from non visa-exempt countries require a Visa and Study Permit in order to enter Canada. More information can be found here .
