| Course Load | Students can register up to a maximum of 5 courses per semester. A course that runs for one semester is worth 0.5 FCE (Full Credit Equivalent) and consists of 36 lecture hours. Typically, 0.5 FCE = 6 ECTS. (Example: 5 courses = 2.5 FCE = 30 ECTS). |
