Exchange Nomination and Application

Nomination process

Host universities should nominate students by emailing LUGO@laurentian.ca before the following deadlines:

- Fall semester (September entry) – **April 1**
- Winter semester (January entry) – **October 1**

Application process

After being nominated by their home university, students will receive an email directly from Laurentian University inviting them to complete an application form.

Application deadline:

- Fall semester (September entry) – **April 30**
- Winter semester (January entry) – **October 30**

Application documents

Exchange students are required to submit the following documents along with their application:

- transcripts
- resume
- statement of interest
- proof of English or French proficiency



Language requirements

For all incoming exchange students, we require a sufficient level of proficiency in the language of study (English or French). We ask students to provide proof of language proficiency by a professional language instructor to attest to their language competencies or by submitting one of the official language test scores:

- TOEFL: 88 overall
- IELTS: 6.5 overall. No band lower than 6.0
- PTE: 60 overall
- Duolingo: 125 overall. No Individual Subscore lower than 110
- TCF: C-1

Documents students will receive

Once students have accepted their offer, they will receive the following documents from Laurentian University:

- learning agreement
- letter of acceptance
- access to apply to on-campus accommodation

Immigration information

Most international students will require a study permit and a visitor visa or ETA to enter Canada. International exchange students who will be attending Laurentian University for a short-term program of up to 6 months in duration do not require a study permit. Students may want to consider applying for a study permit if they want to work on or off campus. Students who have a study permit may be able to work if they follow the conditions of the study permit. They will need to include a letter of explanation to clarify why they are applying for a study permit for one semester when they apply. Credit system: A full-time course load for undergraduate students at Laurentian University is 9 to 15 credits. Must UG courses are 3 credits each, so students usually take up to 3 to 5 courses per semester. It is ultimately up to your home university to decide the credit equivalency for the courses you will be taking.
