Course Registration Process	 Students submit a course selection form indicating their top 10 course choices. Course selection forms must be approved and signed by the student's home university. The course selection forms are reviewed by the IPO in conjunction with an academic advisor to ensure students meet pre-requisite course requirements. The IPO will then conduct registration on the students' behalf (in July for fall or November for winter), registering them in their top selected and approved courses. 				
	Students will be contacted via email if alternative course selections need to be made.				
Housing	 On-Campus: May be available to students studying for the 4-month, fall semester. However, due to high demand, positions are not guaranteed. Students who are coming for the winter semester are able to apply for the waitlist. Offers are given as space becomes available. Health Insurance	All registered international students are automatically enrolled in Memorial University's foreign health insurance plan. Purchase of this insurance plan is mandatory and there is no option for exchange students to opt out of the plan (even if they have already purchased additional international health insurance coverage). The cost is approximately \$206.84/semester. Students will be automatically billed through their MUN Self-Service Account for this service once				
	they have been registered for courses.
