- Mentors Program and other transition programs offered by the Internationalization Office to help new incoming exchange students.



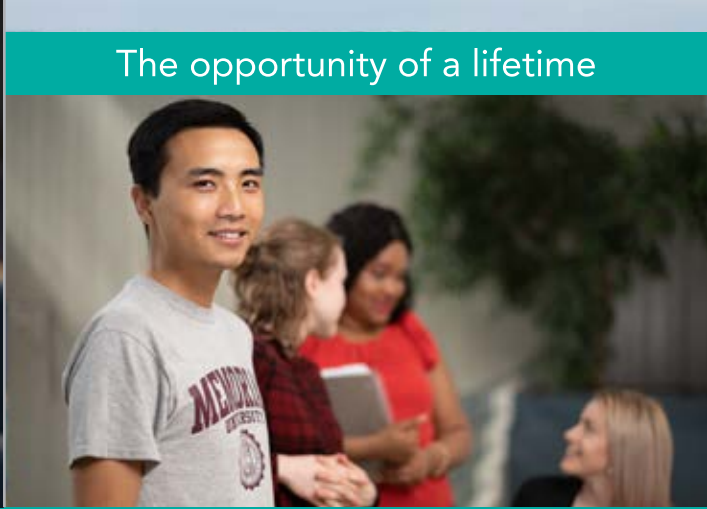
