Eligibility and Requirements

Definition of Visiting (Exchange) Student

In the context of exchange and study abroad programs, 'Visiting Student' is from a Saint Mary's partner institution and has obtained the home institution's approval (via a "Letter of Permission") to take courses at SMU for transfer of credit to their home institution.

Language requirements

Undergraduate students are expected to have English proficiency equivalent to the language requirements <u>here</u>. An official English test score is not required.

Academic requirements

There are no GPA requirements, but a grade of C or higher is required for pre-requisite courses.

Other considerations

- Visiting exchange students must be nominated by the home institution.
- <u>The exchange program is not recommended for students who need a specific set of courses</u>. Courses may not be available due to cancellation, schedule conflicts, lack of pre-requisites, enrollment limits, etc. Students are most successful when they take elective credits at SMU.

Note about graduate candidates

SMU Exchange Program is best suited for students to take undergraduate courses. Due to specialized curricula as well as different admission requirements, schedule, and fee schemes, not all graduate programs are set up for visiting students. Course load per term

Each course meets approx. 3 hrs/wk for 13 wks plus an exam period and is worth 3 credit hours. Visiting students must be full-time, i.e., min 3 courses (9ch) and max. 5 courses (15ch) per term.

Course registration

Course registration is completed online before arrival. Once courses fill up, they close for registration.



• Course registration period for Fall term is open from May 2 2024 – September 13 2024.

• Course registration period for Winter term is open from May 2 2024 – January 17 2025.

Courses with pre-requisites are not open to visiting exchange students, unless the student obtains approval from a SMU academic advisor of the subject area (see list <u>here</u>) prior to registration.

Admission Process

For the international office of the partner institution – Nomination process

Email <u>Miyuki.arai@smu.ca</u> to confirm the number of available exchange places, if not determined yet. For each selected student, the international office of the home institution should:

- Email <u>Global@smu.ca</u> -- include 1) student full name, 2) student email, 3) exchange duration, e.g., one/two semester, 4) exchange period, e.g., Fall2024/Winter2025, 5) confirmation that the student will take undergraduate/Bachelor-level courses at SMU and 6) email address to which an official transcript should be sent at the end of the exchange program.
- Provide the student an electronic copy of a Letter of Permission using the template <u>here</u>.
- Email <u>Global@smu.ca</u> the nominated student's home university transcript in English.

For the nominated student from the partner institution - Admission application process

Following the receipt of an email from the home institution, the nominated student will receive instructions for an online application and on how to upload the Letter of Permission.

Nomination and application periods

For Fall 2024: Nomination from 1 March-17 April 2024; Application from 14 March-1 May 2024 For Winter 2025: Nomination from 1 March-18 August 2024; Application from 14 March-1 Sept 2024 Late nominations/applications will be accepted on a case-by-case basis. Email <u>Miyuki.arai@smu.ca</u>.

Note 1: SMU Fees, payment methods and payment due dates

The highlighted sections above indicate fees which are charged on the students' SMU self-service "banner" account (see <u>here</u>). The total of those amounts should be paid via "CIBC International Pay" (see <u>here</u>) in <u>one lump sum for each semester</u> by the payment due date of **September 13 2024** (Fall term) and by **January 17 2025** (Winter term). ****VERY IMPORTANT NOTE FOR FULL TUITION WAIVER STUDENTS**

On your SMU account, your SMU course fees will be added as you register in courses. This is normal & expected. Your tuition amount will be manually reversed for up to 5 courses per term by the end of September 2024 (Fall Term) and by the end of January 2025 (Winter Term). Until this happens, it will appear as if you owe a large sum of tuition on your account even after you paid your SMU fees (see Note 1 above). You will even receive an email from SMU's Service Centre, advising that you have an overdue account. Don't be alarmed! Simply check your account at the end of September/ January to make sure the correct waiver has been applied. If you paid the right amount of SMU fees before the due date, your account should come to a zero balance after tuition waivers are applied.

To recap, full tuition waiver students will <u>not</u> be responsible for the following tuition-related fees:
