FREDERICTON

The **Fredericton** campus is UNB's original campus and has approximately 7,500 students. It is in the heart of the capital city of New Brunswick with beautiful views of the Saint John River Valley. Fredericton has a population of 80,000.



SAINT JOHN

The **Saint John** campus is UNB's newer campus and has approximately 2,500 students. It overlooks the Bay of Fundy and the City of Saint John, the oldest incorporated city in Canada, which has a population of 120,000.

UNB COURSES (TIMETABLE)



** UNB offers both graduate and undergraduate degrees.*

Exchange students can take a variety of courses from different faculties, or they can take courses from a single faculty. UNB strives to offer a flexible and accommodating academic atmosphere to ensure students can choose courses that are unique, interesting and complement their home university degree program.

When researching course options, exchange students will find that there are some courses that are offered in both Fredericton and Saint John. Some courses may be campus-specific.



Exchange students at UNB are required to maintain a full-time course load, typically consisting of three to four courses per semester. Students may take up to five courses per semester if required (Bachelor level). Graduate-level students will typically take three courses per semester.

ACCOMMODATIONS

UNB offers on-campus residence for both campus locations. **There are various room types and meal plan options to choose from.** Residence applications will be provided with the exchange acceptance package.

Students may also choose to live off campus while on exchange at UNB.

UNB GUARD ME INSURANCE

All International students, including those in the exchange program, are required to have UNB Guard Me International Insurance. Students are not required to pre-purchase and UNB's team will enroll all students automatically, so their insurance is ready for their arrival in Canada. Students can simply pay the \$200 CAD per semester fee upon arrival at UNB.
