# General Information

- Exchange students have the flexibility to enroll in courses across our different **faculties/schools**.
- It's important to note that students **cannot** simultaneously enroll in undergraduate and graduate courses.
- Additionally, students are required to enroll in a minimum of **three courses** and can take a maximum of **six** per semester.
- Furthermore, all **exchange students** are **mandated to purchase** the **official medical insurance provided** by EAFIT.



## Language Requirements

For courses taught in **Spanish**, a **B1** level is required. For courses taught in **English** no certificate is required.

# Our Spanish Program

Universidad EAFIT offers a well-rounded program to help students improve their communication skills. Our Language Center also teaches English, French, Portuguese, German, Italian, and our main language, Spanish (for non-native speakers).

Please note that language courses, including Spanish, have a fee for both national and international students and are not part of the standard program curriculum. # Housing

Each student is responsible for finding and securing accommodation. However, EAFIT has partnered with **VICO**, a platform that offers apartments close to the campus. **VICO** ensures that each apartment is thoroughly inspected and meets quality standards before being listed, providing our students with added confidence.

## Living cost

### Single room or shared apartments:

300 USD - 450 USD per month. The cost will depend on the facilities of the place and the proximity to the campus.

### Food on campus:

- Daily menu: 4.5 USD - 5 USD.
- Other meals: 5 USD - 7.5 USD.

### Transport:

- Bus/metro: 1 USD.
- Taxi/Uber: 5 USD - 6 USD (depending on the routes).

## Migratory Requirements

For an exchange semester, students from the Schengen Area are **not required to apply for a visa to enter Colombia**. Instead, they can enter the country for a 180-day period of stay using a special permit called **PID**. This permit is granted upon arrival in Colombia, and students must present the PID letter provided by us.

Additionally, EAFIT will provide students with a letter to facilitate the process of obtaining the PID permit.
