INTENSIVE SPANISH COURSES

 UIDE offers a free intensive Spanish course before the start of the semester, so exchange students have a chance to improve their language skills before taking their first class.

CLASSES IN ENGLISH

 For exchange students who do not speak Spanish, classes in English are available for both Ecuadorian and foreign students. Classes in English vary from one semester to another according to de career needs.





Nomination

 Before applying, students interested in doing an exchange at UIDE should contact their international office. The exchange coordinator then sends an email to UIDE nominating the student for an exchange.

Nomination period

Spring Semester: September - October

Fall Semester: March - April

Application

 Once the nomination is accepted by UIDE, the student completes the application by sending the requested documents.

Application deadline

• Spring Semester: November 15th

• Fall Semester: May 15th

Admissions requirements for exchange students

- Having two semesters of university completed.
- Minimum GPA of 2,8/4 or 80/100.
- Spanish proficiency: minimum Level B1 is strongly recommended.
- English proficiency is recommended for those students who take courses only in English.
- International health insurance.

Visa

- To stay in Ecuador for more than 90 days, students need a visa. Semester/year exchange students need to apply for a Temporary Residence - Student Visa

Health insurance requirements

 All exchange students are required to have health insurance valid for the duration of their stay.



INTERNATIONAL STUDENT LIFE

Airport pickup

 Either a university representative or a student's host family will pick up the student at the airport on arrival in Ecuador.

Accommodation

 Exchange students can choose to live with an Ecuadorian host family or find housing on their own. The exchange coordinator is in charge of placing students with host families, which have been vetted by ORII.

Staying with Ecuadorian families is part of the cultural immersion experience and gives students the opportunity to interact with locals and have a safe and comfortable place to live. Host family stay includes:

- Wifi
- Basic cleaning
- Laundry
- Breakfast and dinner

Cost: \$500 - \$600 per month

 On-campus housing: facilities equipped with WiFi, 24/7 security, kitchen and shared bathrooms are available.

* The housing is located 45 minutes away from the city center.

TUITION FEES

 No academic costs are charged to exchange students who come from a university with which UIDE has a bilateral agreement. For students of unaffiliated universities, tuition fees vary depending on the length of the exchange program and specific classes taken.

ESTIMATED BUDGET

Rent: \$300 - \$400 per month in shared apartment Food. \$300 - \$400 per month (if not staying with a host family)

Average everyday costs in Quito:

- 500ml bottle of water: \$0.50
- Lunch in UIDE cafeteria: \$ 3.85 (includes soup, main dish, dessert, juice)
- City bus: \$ 0.35
- Daytime taxi ride within the city: minimum \$1.50 depending on the destination, average of \$5
- Dinner in a nice restaurant: \$20 \$30
