Application Procedure

A link to our online application form will be sent to all students who have been nominated by their home universities. Students must only be nominated through existing agreements in the subject area of their current studies.		
Nomination deadlines	Full Year / Sem 1	15th March	Sem 2 15th October
Application Deadlines	Full Year / Sem 1	15th April	Sem 2 31st October
Decision Response	Students will receive an acceptance e-mail within 5 weeks of the application deadline.		
Recommended Language Skills	As part of their application, students will be required to certify that they have an English Level B2 on the CEFR . They will have to upload evidence of their certification to complete their application. In the absence of this, applications will not be considered complete: https://www.universityofgalway.ie/erasmus-programme/incomingstudents/informationforcoordinators/#tab2 For incoming teaching staff, we would recommend Level C1 .

Module Catalogue	All modules offered to visiting students are listed in our handbooks located on our website										
How many modules/credits can be taken in each semester?	Each class is weighted at 5 or 10 ECTS credits. Students cannot take more than 30 ECTS credits per semester, 60 ECTS per year , which is a normal course load for our domestic students.										
Where can I find timetables?	Timetables are available on discipline websites. These are linked in the relevant discipline area of the student handbook.										
English Classes	Our English Language Centre provides English for Academic Purposes (EAP) Workshops for all Erasmus students to develop their English-language skills. Please note that this course does not carry ECTS credits.										
When will academic transcripts be sent?	Students will receive their transcripts no sooner than 6 weeks after the official release of results.

Accommodation

On-Campus

University of Galway has a small number of on-campus beds dedicated to our Erasmus Students. To ensure a fair process, we hold a lottery for these beds based on students' application information.

We emphasize the importance of students exploring the option of private accommodation in the meantime. Most students (across domestic, international and study abroad) live off campus in private accommodation. Many students live on the outskirts of the city and commute via public transport. Because this is the usual practice, we are well set up to help students source off-campus accommodation.

We regret that, apart from this, the university cannot reserve accommodation for incoming Erasmus students. *All accommodation enquiries should be directed to the [Accommodation Advisory Service](#).*

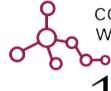
