Nominations are to be submitted digitally via the nomination form sent by UL Global each year. The nominated student's information should be submitted by their Home University. Nominations should include the student's name, email address, area of study and the Erasmus+ code of the Institution.

Our Application Procedure

Once the student has been officially nominated, they will receive an email with an application link and a guide to the online application procedure. Applicants will require a recent Transcript, Identification and a recent Language Certificate to complete their application. Once students have completed their application, they will be emailed with further information regarding accommodation, modules, etc.

UL Clubs and Societies

Clubs & Societies are an opportunity to have fun and make new friends and in doing so maybe try exciting new activities or to compete in the top sporting intercollegiate competitions in Ireland and overseas. Clubs & Societies are run voluntarily by students for the students to complement the busy academic life while here in the University of Limerick and everyone is very welcome to join.

Modules

A normal semester load at the University of Limerick is 30 ECTS credits. Most modules have a credit weighting of 6 ECTS so students should take five modules per semester. Erasmus students are required to take a majority of modules from their field of study. Erasmus+ Students can take between three and six modules while in UL. Acceptance on these modules is subject to academic prerequisites, timetabling constraints and number of students enrolled. Students can preview the modules that are available for both Autumn and Spring semesters.

Modules offered in the area of Psychology, Sports Sciences and Journalism are subject to restrictions: only students nominated within the relevant subject areas may take part in those modules.

ECTS Credits

The normal course load at the University of Limerick is 5 modules per semester. Erasmus+ students are limited to a maximum of 6 modules and a minimum of 3 modules per semester. Most UL modules are worth 6 ECTS credits.

Learning Agreement Requirement

Students are required to send their Learning Agreement directly to their academic coordinator at the University of Limerick for approval of modules. If a student is using an online learning agreement they must enter their academic coordinator's contact email as the responsible person in UL. Details of the students' academic coordinator in the University of Limerick will be sent to them after their nomination has been processed, student's should only submit their learning agreement once they receive this information.

Language Requirements

The language of instruction and assessment for all programmes in the University of Limerick is English (with the exception of foreign language modules, e.g. French, German, Spanish, Japanese). A B2 level of English is required and certification confirming this is necessary to complete your application. English as a Foreign Language course is available to Erasmus+students as a module.

The Language Centre of the University of Limerick offers a General English Year-Round Programme which includes standard and intensive language courses. This is suitable for students with various levels of English who wish to improve their general English language skills.

Academic Transcripts

A softcopy of each student transcripts will be emailed to the Partner Institution and the student, by the University of Limerick. The PDF will be issued within 5 weeks of publication of UL results online. Students may also access their results online via the student portal prior to receiving their results via email.

Counselling Services

UL offers a counselling service called <u>UL Student Counselling and Wellbeing Service</u>. This is a free and confidential service acting as a first point of contact for mental health needs. As well as counselling, this service offers Mental Health Education and wellbeing maintenance via online platforms.

Special Needs & Disabilities Information

The student will be asked when completing their application if they have any special needs or requirements. The Global Office will then provide the contact information of our Disability Services Department to any student who requires it. Incoming students may also contact the Disability Services directly.

Our <u>Disability Services Department</u> will then confirm with the student the supports that are available at UL. The home university must confirm that funding will be provided to facilitate any/all supports, for example, scribes, transport, carers/assistants, hire or purchase of equipment etc.

Medical Centre

The Student Health Centre is an urgent care/advisory service and deals with all general health issues as they present. Our services include access to: doctor (GP), nurse, contraceptive clinic, sexual health clinic and physiotherapy. This is not a free service and fees apply

Insurance requirements for incoming Erasmus+ students

All EU students are eligible to avail of full public health care services in Ireland, on presentation of a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). Additional private health care can be obtained from the following Irish Health insuance companies: VHI or Laya Healthcare.

Immigration information for incoming Exchange students

All non-EU students coming to the University of Limerick are required by the Irish Department of Justice, Home Affairs and Migration to register with the Irish immigration authorities.

VISA applications should be made through the Irish Embassy in the student's home country.

Immigration fee is €300.
