Academic Calendar

The Academic Year is divided into two semesters:

Winter Semester: (mid-September / mid-February)

Spring Semester: (mid-February / end-July)

The exams of the first semester take place in December, January and February, the exams of the second semester take place in June, July and September.

Credit System

CFU - Crediti Formativi Universitari (Local Credits)

1 CFU = 1 ECTS Each credit corresponds to around 25 hours of overall work by the student, including individual study, lectures (6-8 hours per credit), practical training, seminar, etc..

- 6 CFU credits correspond to 48 hours of lectures;
- 9 CFU credits correspond to 72 hours of lectures;
- 12 CFU credits correspond to 96 hours of lectures and seminars.

Grading System

The Italian Grading System ranges from 18/30 to 30/30.

The highest mark is 30/30 with distinction (lode).

Exams under 18/30 are considered as "fail/not passed".

Sometimes courses ("laboratory/workshop") may report "Idoneo/Non Idoneo" or "Pass/Fail", NO GRADE.

This is because some courses, in force of national regulations, do not foresee a grade award but only an attendance condition (*frequentato/attended*) or



	a simple “pass” (<i>Idoneo/adequate</i>) grade. No grade assigned but the students earn the credits. The correspondence between ETCS evaluations and Italian marks is the following: A = 30/30 and 30/30 <i>cum laude</i> B = 28/30 and 29/30 C = 26/30 and 27/30 D = 20/30 - 25/30 E = 18/30 - 19/30 F = Fail < 18/30 https://www.economia.unifi.it/vp-622-ects-tables.html

Language of Teaching	The courses are taught mostly in Italian, however, there are some English courses as well. See also the Course Catalogue
Course Catalogues	List of Courses in English A.Y. 2025 - 2026 Please pay attention to Prerequisites, if they are required. Course Load: A maximum of 30 ECTS per term
Language Requirements	Students (Non-Native English speakers) studying in the English-taught programmes, should have at least B2 level English and must submit one of the following documents: IELTS min 5.5, TOEFL IB min 65, DET min 110, BEC Higher/CAE, CEFR.



	For Students studying courses taught in Italian it's mandatory to have a B1 level in Italian according to the "Common European Framework of Reference for Languages". A "Certificate of Language Proficiency", proving the knowledge of B1 level Italian should be provided during the application process. <i>Only language certifications issued by official bodies (Cambridge, Toefl, etc.), by Language Schools, and by University Linguistic Institutes are accepted.</i> <i>OSL self-evaluation tests or certificates of attendance of language courses (without exams) are not accepted.</i> However, it is recommended to all Incoming Students to have a basic knowledge of the Italian language to enjoy their experience in Florence; it is in the interest of the student to acquire some skills in Italian language for his/her daily life in Florence.

Process	Students send the application documents via mail to: incoming@economia.unifi.it - Application form; - Learning agreement: this document should be delivered through EWP if host University is connected with this new system, otherwise the Pdf form must be sent via email together with the other documents. - Copy (an English version) of Academic Transcript of Records, Bachelor and Master; - Official language certificate or confirmation letter of Language Skills; - Copy of national identity card (for EU members) or a copy of passport (for non-EU members); Erasmus+ students with non-EU/EEA citizenship: copy of valid residence permit in the country of their home university Application form and relevant documents are available on our website: https://www.economia.unifi.it/vp-227-incoming-students.html in the Section "Forms and Templates" Application Form and Learning Agreement (Pdf) must be <u>Signed and Stamped</u>, where indicated, <u>by the Coordinator of the Home Institution</u>. Forms without all the requested signatures and stamps will not be accepted! The acceptance letter will be issued only when the application is complete.
Enrolling process at UNIFI	Students need to enter their personal data through the online procedure and, after their arrival, the office in charge of the official enrolment - the Erasmus Desk - will contact them with additional requests in order to complete the procedure and assign the "Matricola" (UNIFI registration number - Student's USER ID). Orientation/Welcome Day	Students are required to attend a mandatory Orientation/Welcome Day before the start of each semester. The exact date will be communicated to students.



Change Learning Agreement	If students want to make changes to their Learning Agreement after they have registered, they should contact their International Office (ORI). Please note that the last opportunity to add or drop courses will be by the end of the 3rd teaching week and no changes will be allowed after that.
Transcript of Records/Certificate of Attendance	At the end of the students' mobility period, the Erasmus Desk, - i.e the office in charge of the Enrolment process - sends the official Transcript of Records and Certificate of Attendance <u>by email</u> directly to the Home University/Coordinator. ONLY Digital Document are available The Certification of Stay issued upon arrival and departure is in Unifi format. No other form or declaration will be signed.

Visa/Residence Permit	If you are a Non-EU citizen intending to enter Italy, you must submit your visa application (for STUDY reasons/University Enrolment) and the relevant documents to the Italian diplomatic representation. Within 8 working days from your arrival, in order to legitimate your stay, you must submit your <u>Stay/Residence Permit request</u> using a dedicated kit



	available at qualified post offices (Sportello Amico). If you are Non EU citizen regularly living in another EU country for study reasons, you are not requested to get a visa to come studying at UniFI provided that your stay is long no more than 360 days and that your EU residence permit is valid for the whole period you will spend in Florence. Once arrived, in order to legitimate your stay, you must submit the <u>declaration of presence</u> to the Immigration Office-Questura (Central Police Station in the province) within 8 working days from your arrival. EU students, or students coming from EFTA countries (Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland) who are going to stay in Italy for over a 3 months period, must register at the Local Anagrafe (Population Register office) of the municipality of current residence. Health Care System	International students, both from within and outside the EU that are enrolled at university can register to the National Health Service (<i>Servizio Sanitario Nazionale</i> - SSN) for the duration of their studies. The registration will entitle the student to be enrolled in the regional health service system, to choose a General Practitioner and to receive the same healthcare services as any Italian citizen. Those who are registered to SSN have the same rights and duties of Italian citizens including the co-payment of fees for the services provided (ticket). The contribution varies according to the financial situation of the applicant. In some cases (e.g. students) applicants pay a flat fee. Buddy system	Each exchange student (and/or group) is allocated to a UNIFI “buddy” to help him/her with daily life, our University life and social integration. The main purpose of this programme is to assist international students with their integration into Italian life and to enable them to undertake their academic responsibilities successfully.



Multicultural Tutors

Students speaking the most used languages for international exchanges, help in the early stage of foreign students' integration in Florence. They combine their subject area expertise with the necessary language and cultural skills to communicate with foreign students in the most common languages and work towards creating self-motivated independent students.

Together with the International Relations Offices of the Schools and the staff from the International Relations Central Area, the multicultural tutors help their peers to adjust to a different environment by providing both academic and non-academic support, give information about university services and city life and offer fully assistance on foreign student general issues.
