Notes: Regarding Japanese Language Program (JPL) for Japanese Learners

- You will be placed in one of the JPL core courses (Pre-elementary to Advanced) based on your result at the Japanese Placement Test conducted at the start of the semester.
- You may register for only one JPL core course in each semester.
- The skill courses available to you will depend on your JPL core level. If you are in the intermediate level (JPL 300, 305, 307) you are eligible to take JPL skill courses (JPL361, 381, 390, 391, 394).
- "Japanese Practice" courses (JPL231, 331) are one-credit independent study courses with Pass/Fail grades. Students are expected to find ways to improve their Japanese language skills through the utilization of audio visual materials such as Japanese movies and TV dramas, and other authentic materials. Students are expected to work on by their own under supervision of the course instructor.
