## **INSTITUTIONAL INFORMATION**

With tradition and history, the Ritsumeikan Trust opened APU in April 2000 as the first genuine international university in Japan.

The APU campus is a truly multicultural and multilingual environment with nearly half of the student population made up of international students from around the world and an equally diverse faculty.

Our campus is in Beppu City, which is located in the southern part of Japan and is one of the country's most famous hot spring resorts, attracting tourists from Japan and abroad.





## Nomination Requirements:

Nominees must meet these criteria at the time of nomination.

- Nominees must have completed at least one semester of study at their host university. Also the official grades from previous semesters at the home university must be available at the time of nomination to confirm if nominees meet the GPA requirement.
- Nominees must have a minimum GPA of 2.00 on a 4.00 scale.
- Nominees must be in the undergraduate level of study or in the equivalent level of study at their • home university.
- Nominees whose first language is not English or Japanese must meet the language requirements below.

## **Application Requirements:**

#### Applicants must meet these criteria at the time of application.

- Applicants must be enrolled in a partner university overseas and must have completed at least 1 semester at their home university.
- Applicants must be nominated officially by their home university.
- Applicants must have a minimum GPA of 2.00 on a 4.00 scale.
- Applicants whose first language is not English or Japanese must meet the language requirements below.

## HOUSING AND LIVING EXPENSES

APU provides off-campus housings for all exchange students. There is no other housing options available. Students must choose one of the below option at the time of applications.

• Rent, Utility fees, non-refundable moving fee and Bedding/Linen fee are included.

• Students will be asked to pay fees for the entire period of their stay at APU prior to arrival.

• Invoice will be sent upon admission approval (Payment method: bank wire transfer only)

• No meal plan is available.

• Other accommodation options are not available for exchange students.

#### Visa:

All students are responsible for getting a Student Visa prior to entering Japan.

After students are accepted, APU will apply for a Certificate of Eligibility (CoE) on behalf of the student. Once the CoE is issued by the Immigration Bureau (Japan) , APU sends it to the students. Students may apply for their student visa at the closest Japanese Embassy prior to arrival in Japan.

All one semester exchange students will be given a 1 year student visa even if the study period is for 1 semester only. For one year exchange students, a 1 year and 3 months visa will be given. Students are strictly required to leave Japan after the completion of their intended study period at APU.

#### Driving:

Exchange students are not allowed to drive or buy motor vehicles including motorbikes during their study abroad program at APU.

#### **Employment:**

Part-time jobs are sometimes available within the university and in the city. For students who wish to work off-campus, they have to look for part-time jobs by themselves and Japanese proficiency is oftentimes required.

**Employment Regulations:** 

Students are required to file for a "Work Permit" to the Immigration Bureau before getting a job and participate in activities other than studying. This form is available at the Student Office (APU). Students can apply for a Work Permit after receiving their Residence Card. It may take about two weeks.

#### Buddy System:

APU BUDDY is an APU student organization that helps you get started smoothly in your life at APU and in Beppu. APU BUDDY also plans and organizes events for you to get to know each other. Exchange students can sign up for the APU BUDDY after their admissions to APU is officially accepted.
