Course information	A list of courses in English and Spanish, though, will be sent by email to the student. Students must send the learning agreement 1 month before starting courses. Once the student has started classes, they will only have one week to adjust the schedule and course load.



Language of instruction and requirements	Language of instruction: Spanish and English. Students must have an intermediate to advanced level of Spanish to enroll in the mobility program (Basic Spanish for Japan, South Korea, Taiwan, Hong Kong). Candidates must present a Spanish B2//English B2 certificate. All students must take a Spanish placement test at Anáhuac Querétaro and follow the requirements that the head of the Language Center indicates. Spanish course is mandatory during the semester without any extra cost (Once a week, 3 hours) *Spanish course platform costs \$25.00 USD (one pay student's arrival).

Arrival dates	We suggest students arrive at least 8 days before starting courses.	
Transcripts released	Digital transcripts are sent to the mobility coordinator at the home university approximately 5 weeks after the end of the semester. Please notify us in advance if you require original notes to be sent.	
Application form and documents required	Once we receive the nomination from the home university, Anáhuac Querétaro will send the student our registration/application link by e-mail. Supporting documents: official transcripts, one recommendation letter, intention letter, curriculum vitae (resume) in Spanish/English, Spanish/English certificate, passport (ID image), photo in JPEG format (no glasses, white background, no photoshop), statement of good health signed by a doctor and International Insurance Health Policy.	
Health Insurance requirements	Students must have an international health insurance plan with coverage in Mexico for their entire exchange program. Coverage must include the repatriation of remains. Before arrival, students must hand in a copy of their insurance policy.	



Accommodation	Anáhuac University does not offer on-campus accommodation. However, XENTRIC Inicio Xentric Anáhuac (xentricanahuac.com) and ALTANA https://www.altanaqueretaro.com/ student residences are available within walking distance from campus. The application deadline is 30 days before the arrival date. Students may make their housing arrangements under their full responsibility. Living in Zibatá (XENTRIC or ALTANA Student residences), Condesa (Zibatá), Zakia, El Refugio, and Juriquilla areas are highly recommended.

Air transportation	Anáhuac Querétaro does not offer airport picking service for students. IMPORTANT: Mexico City and Cancun are major hubs with plenty of flight options. From there, you can easily catch a bus or a short flight to Querétaro. When you enter Mexico, the immigration official at the port of entry will grant you a number of days stay in Mexico and write this on your visitor permit. This will be a <i>maximum</i> of 180 days; but it may be less than 180 days.
VISA information	Student VISA is not required for one-semester students (less than 180 days). Accepted Students	Welcome session mandatory SPRING SEMESTER early January, FALL SEMESTER early August. Course planning: you must verify the course offer with the academic staff. The learning agreement must be signed by your Academic Coordinator before arriving at Anáhuac Querétaro.



ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- Home institution must nominate students by sending an email to luciano.gamez@anahuac.mx (student's complete name, major, age, day of birth, e-mail, and the program name enrolled at Anáhuac Querétaro).
Later they will be asked to send the information and supporting documents (PDF) through Google Forms link.
- Candidates must be enrolled as full-time students at their home institution and have completed at least two full years of studies.
- **The grading system at Universidad Anáhuac Querétaro is based on a 5 to 10 scale (6 is the minimum approbatory and 10 is excellent). Students must attend 80% of classes to receive a final grade otherwise they will fail the course. If students have more than 6 absences during the semester, they fail the course.**
- Anáhuac Querétaro does not exempt unattendance under any circumstances.
IMPORTANT: We do not have resit exams.
- Students must validate courses taken at their home University. **Please keep in mind that course selection at Anáhuac Querétaro University may change during the first days of class. Therefore, we suggest that students have a list of additional courses (before arriving in Querétaro) in case there are any modifications or cancellations. Academic Staff from each faculty will help to choose the best options, according to each student.**
- Spanish Language Course is MANDATORY. This course is designed for students who wish to improve their language skills during the semester. Students can receive ECTS for this course (6 credits).
- Students must enroll in a minimum of 18 credits (3 courses) and maximum 54 credits (9 courses). Between 5 and 7 courses at Anáhuac Querétaro to complete their ECTS (depending on Home University requirements).
