Academic Calendar



- **Fall** (1st Semester):
August 11th – December 10th, 2025 (Exam period included)
- **Spring** (2nd Semester):
January 12th – May 20th, 2025 (Exam period included)

Orientation Course



One week before the start of classes and it is **MANDATORY**.

- Fall (1st Semester):
August 5th 2025.
- Spring (2nd Semester):
January 6th 2026.

* These dates could be changed from one or two weeks.

Learning Agreement



The learning agreement must be sent to the Academic Advisor when the Academic Offer is confirmed. (July and December)

Arrival in Mérida



We strongly recommend students' arrival one week before the orientation day.

Nomination Deadlines



Fall term: April 15th
Spring term: October 15th

Language proficiency



For exchange students we require a **B1** level of **Spanish** in order to be able to follow the lectures. Students need to present a **Certificate B1** or a document issued by the University Language department of the home institution. **Courses in English: Certificate B2** or a document issued by the University Language department of the home institution.



Spanish Language Course



We strongly recommend exchange students whose native language is not Spanish, to enroll in the Spanish Language Course (6 credits).

Programs



Consider that the even semesters: 2, 4, 6 and 8 are offered in January while the odd ones: 1, 3, 5, 7 and 9 are offered in August.

Exchange students must select all their courses from the Bachelor's degree to which they are assigned. (Course offering may vary each semester.) [Clic aquí](#)

Anahuac Mayab Credits



- Minimum: 18 Mexican credits.
 - Maximum: 66 Mexican credits.
- Exchange students usually take from 24 up to 30 credits (most of the courses are 6 credits).

Transcripts



The Transcript of Records (Grade Report) will be sent to the International Office at the home University (not to the students) in February for the Fall Term and in July for the Spring Term.

International Health Insurance



All incoming exchange students must take the University's health insurance plan. Insurance is charged by term and students will pay it directly after receiving their acceptance letter.
