Undergraduate Programs

30 programs in 7 faculties are open for mobility students

- 1. Business

- 7. Santa Teresa Campus: Nursing, Physiotherapy, Sports Science, and Dentistry.

Graduate Programs

Especialidades at the Business School are open to students who have authorization from their home university and have completed an undergraduate degree. Courses have some restrictions. Graduate programs in other faculties may be available upon request.

The Fall **MIEX** Program will only accept students with advanced level of English. TOEFL IBT score of above 92. Letters from home university are not accepted. The MIEX program is not available in the Spring semester.

LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION AND LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS



Language of instruction: Spanish Level B2

MIEX Program (only Fall semester) English Level C1

- Students must have an intermediate to advanced level of Spanish to enroll in the mobility program.
- Candidates must take a Spanish placement exam proving CEFR B2 level (DELE or SIELE).
- Students who do not have an official certificate must take a Spanish exam at La Salle.
- It is important to follow the decision made by the head of the Spanish department.
- Spanish classes have an extra cost and offer academic credit.
- Costs will be provided at student's arrival.

Transcripts released

Digital transcripts are sent to mobility coordinator in home university, approximately five weeks after the end of the semester.



EXCHANGE STUDENT INFORMATION

1. Application form and documents required:

Through http://bit.ly/LaSalleInternacional the home university registers students online, includes list of requested

courses, and supporting documents in a single-color PDF:

2. Health insurancerequirements:

Students must have an international health insurance plan with coverage in Mexico for their entire exchange program. Coverage must include repatriation of remains. Before arrival, students must hand a copy of their insurance policy.

3. Accommodation:

Universidad La Salle does not offer on campus accommodation. However. Home-stays with Mexican families are available within walking distance from campus. Monthly plans vary from \$7,000.00 MX to \$10,000.00 MX (subject to change).

Application deadline is 30 days before arrival date. Students may do their own housing arrangements under their full responsibility. Living in the Condesa-Roma area is highly recommended.

4. Air transportation:

Universidad La Salle does not offer airport picking up service for students. Students should use an authorized taxi from the airport upon arrival. Service to the La Salle area has a cost of \$30.00 USD approximately.

5. VISA information:

Student VISA is not required for one semester students. However, candidates must check if they are from a country that requires Visa even if it is not for studying purposes. https://www.inm.gob.mx/gobmx/word/index.php/paises-requieren-visa-para-mexico/.

If coming for two semesters, students must acquire a student VISA in their home country, and request a Non-Immigrants Form within the first 30-days of arrival in Mexico. More information here.

Please consider that student visas do not enable the visa holder to work.

6. Cost of living (USD approx./ per month):

Housing: \$350.00 to \$600; food: \$150.00 to \$250; transportation: \$10.00 to \$20.00; cellphone: \$10.00 to \$15.00; other personal expenses: \$100.00 to \$150.00

SUMMARY INFORMATION

- Home institution must nominate students by sending an email to inter-academico@lasalle.mx. Later they will be asked to send the supporting documents (EXCEL and PDF) through a http://bit.ly/LaSalleInternacional.
- Candidates must be enrolled as full-time students at home institution, have completed at least 50% of total credits, have a minimum **GPA of 2.5/4**, be able to follow courses in Spanish.
- Grading system at Universidad La Salle is based on a 5 to 10 scale (6 is the minimum passing grade and 10 is excellent). Students must attend 80 % of classes to receive a final grade. Universidad La Salle does not exempt unattendance under any circumstances.
- Each effective learning hour equals 0.0625 La Salle credits. For instance, 4.5 credit course totals 72 hours ofwork (in the classroom and independent).
- Students must validate courses taken at La Salle with their home institution.
- For undergraduate programs, students must enroll a **minimum of 4** and a **maximum of 9** courses. For graduate programs, students must enroll a **minimum of 3** and a **maximum of 5** courses.
- Students must have an advanced level of Spanish to enroll in the mobility program. Spanish courses are mandatory for students not meeting the B2 level; fees per course apply.
- Tuition fees are waived to mobility students. However, students are asked to pay a mobility fee of \$2,500.00 MX upon arrival. If staying for the academic year, the fee for the second semester is \$1,500.00 MX.
- Before arrival, students must sign and fill emergency information sheet with photo, and hoja de políticas de La Salle.
- Upon arrival, students must provide a copy of migratory form (FMM) and VISA (if required).
