Enrollment Timeline

NOMINATION BY THE HOME INSTITUTION Nomination is done through a dedicated form shared with partners. Only basic information about students and their programs in ESCA is required. (Full Name, Date of Birth, Current Level, Current Field of Study...). The deadlines are as follows:

Fall: May 1

Spring: October 1

APPLICATION PROCESS

Students receive instructions by email, to complete an application form with their personal information and required documents. The deadlines are as follows:

Fall: May 15

Spring: October 15

ADMISSION LETTER

After reviewing students' applications, they receive the official admission letter from ESCA.

COURSE SELECTION Students will receive the course list and are invited to complete their Learning Agreement, which must be approved by their home institution and submitted by the given deadlines. Upon arrival, students will have an Add & Drop period. The deadlines are as follows:

Fall: July 10

Spring: December 1

USEFUL DOCUMENTS

Students receive a serie of documents and information, to help them better prepare their exchange. (Calendar, Incoming Guide, Accommodation Options...)

PRE-ARRIVAL WEBINAR

A webinar is held to meet international students virtually for the first time, present the necessary information and answer their questions.

INTEGRATION SEMINAR PROGRAM

The Integration Seminar program is shared with students in advance to give them an overview of the upcoming activities.



Requirements

English Proficiency:

The scores below are accepted for the English programs:

> TOEIC 785

> IELTS 6.5

> TOEFL iBT 79

Native English speakers and students whose entire study programs at their home universities are taught in English are exempt.

Letters from the Home Institution are accepted. Any other english level proof must be reviewed for approval.

French Proficiency :

For the French programs, a B2 level is required (for non-native speakers).

Application Documents:

> Identity Photo

> Copy of the passport

> CV

- > Cover Letter
- > Transcripts
- > English/French Proficiency (for non-native speakers)

Depending on the application, other documents may be required through the form.

Double Degree :

1. Application:

In addition to the previous list of documents, the following application elements are also required:

- > Baccalaureate Diploma (High School Diploma)
- > Baccalaureate Official Transcript
- > Certificate of completion of the year preceding the degree the student is seeking, during their exchange program.

(Example: Certificate of completion for the second year of the bachelor's program, if the student is pursuing a double degree during their third and final year of the program).

2. Upon Arrival:

An equivalence process for the Baccalaureate Diploma is mandatory through the Ministry of Higher Education in Morocco. Our pedagogical team assists double-degree students with this process and provides the necessary information. Therefore, students must have the original and physical versions of these documents.

3. English Requirement:

An English proficiency certificate is required, as per the Double Degree agreement, even if the language of instruction is not English.

Academic Highlights

Teaching Methods

The Teaching methods are based on a variety of elements and tools, including case studies, group projects, workshops, business games and extracurricular activities.

A business-oriented pedagogy is central, and increasingly, digital platforms play a significant role in enhancing the learning experience.





Workload & Grading System

Each semester's courses and their corresponding ECTS credits (European Credit Transfer System) total at least 30 ECTS. Grades are on a scale of 20. A conversion table is included with official transcripts, as well as the ECTS.

Attendance

Classes are conducted in person; therefore, attendance is mandatory. Students must attend at least 70% of the total hourly volume of each subject to not impact their grades. Academic rules will be shared later.

Visa

Depending on the home country, a visa might be needed or not.

- > Citizens exempt from an entry visa in Morocco are allowed to stay for up to 90 days.
- > This stay is automatically renewed after exiting and re-entering Moroccan territory.
