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Curriculum changes in our Bachelor programme

As of the fall term of 2019, we have started changing the curriculum of our Bachelor programme, starting with the first Bachelor year. For the academic year 2020-2021, we changed the second Bachelor year and in the academic year 2021-2022 we will finish by changing the third Bachelor year.

You may notice that the academic calendar works with blocks in the first and second Bachelor year and with trimesters in the third Bachelor year. Some courses are switching to different Bachelor years. At this point the curriculum for the third year remains the same. This means that you may see some courses offered in different Bachelor years.

Minor courses

Minor courses are only offered in the fall term and have a workload of 15 EC. This is because a minor is a combination of 2-3 courses that specialize in one subject. As it is one course, there is no subdivision of the EC possible. It is comparable to a major, only smaller in size and workload.

The application for minors takes place between mid-April and mid-May. After the deadline in May, it is no longer possible to apply for a minor. As minors are very popular, we ask students to apply for three minors and to rank these in order of their preference. In June we will confirm to the students for which minor they will be registered. Exchange students get priority for the minor application, however, there are only a certain number of spots available per minor for exchange students. It is not mandatory to participate in a minor. Students can participate in one minor only.

RSM courses

Incoming exchange students can participate in courses from all three Bachelor years, provided the home university approves as well. Course manuals will not be published until about two weeks prior to the start of the courses.

We urge students to check early on with their home university which courses would be approved, so that they can immediately apply for the courses once the course registration opens.

Courses at other faculties

Next to the courses from RSM, there are also a few other faculties of the Erasmus University Rotterdam that allow our exchange students to participate in a course at their faculty. The faculties that accept our students are:

- The Erasmus School of History, Culture and Communication (ESHCC, including IBCoM)
- The Erasmus School of Social and Behavioural Sciences (ESSB)

Students can apply for one course at these faculties and in some cases two courses, however, this is exceptional.

Furthermore, the Erasmus University College (EUC) also offers a few courses in which they can accept a few students. Please note though, that spots are very limited at EUC and this faculty is not on campus, but in the city center of Rotterdam.

General information on RSM courses and minors

- For all courses and minors, we work on first-come, first-served basis;
- Course and minor application at RSM are done via an application form that is provided by the International Office. There is no online course registration system at this moment;
- It is the responsibility of the students to only apply for courses that will be approved by the home university;
- Students are required to register for enough courses to meet the minimum workload requirements of both the home university as well as RSM;
- Each trimester will start with a switch period for the RSM courses (not for minors), only during that period, students can change/add or drop courses. Please note that this may change in future;
- Only the courses and minors mentioned on our course overview are open to incoming exchange students;
- The curriculum of the Bachelor 2 courses is currently being changed and the changes will be effective as of the start of the academic year 2020-2021. Therefore, the course codes are not available yet and these courses are also not visible in the course guide yet. The course guide will be updated with this information around July/August 2020, in time for the course registration.
