It is specialized in the areas of economics and business. UP has been ranked as the most prestigious higher education institution in its fields of specialization in Peru, and among the leading institutions of its kind in the Latin American region.



1. Exchange Program



Important: our semesters consist of 16 weeks. Out of those, 14 weeks correspond to classes; one week for the mid-terms exams and another one for final exams.

Classes are expected to be offered in a face to face mode. International students must have an exchange student visa to participate in Spring and Fall 2025 intakes.

Required application

and visa application documents:

Students nominated by their home universities to study at Universidad del Pacífico as exchange students will receive detailed instructions to start the application and visa application process.

FOR APPLICATION:

- •Official Transcript: academic record with the heading, stamp, or signature of the home institution
- Photo of the passport data page
- International health insurance certificate
- Proof of language proficiency (Spanish, English, or both)

FOR VISA:

- **Proof of funds**: bank statement or letter issued by the bank indicating a minimum of USD 3,500.00 (considering USD 700.00 per month of stay in Peru)
- Flight ticket (round-trip ticket)





The languages of instruction at UP are Spanish and English. Most of the courses during the semester at Universidad del Pacífico are taught in Spanish; however, courses taught fully in English are included in the academic offer each semester. Students can take courses in English only, Spanish only, or both according to their proficiency and preferences.

LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS:

For courses taught in Spanish, non-native-speaking students must submit a Spanish proficiency certificate of at least B2 level. For Finance and Economics courses, the minimum level required is C1.

For courses taught in English, non-native English-speaking students must submit a certificate of proficiency in English of at least B2 level (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages) for undergraduate courses and C1 for graduate courses.

In both cases, the certificate should not overpass two years from the date of issue.

If the student plans to take graduate-level courses, they must prove a C1-level proficiency in Spanish. These courses are offered in modules, exclusively in Spanish, and classes are also offered on weekends.

INTENSIVE SPANISH LANGUAGE COURSES:

For an additional fee: Elemental, Intermediate, and Advanced Level Spanish Courses for exchange students are available at our Language Center. These courses are offered starting 3 weeks before the beginning of the semester. After being nominated, students will receive information about the possibility of taking these courses and the conditions.



Course information

Universidad del Pacífico offers courses in the following fields: Accounting, Business Administration, Marketing, International Business, Business Engineering, Information Engineering, Economics, Finance, Law. Some courses have prerequisites that must be met before students can enroll in them. Universidad del Pacífico also offers three new programs: Digital Humanities; Innovation and Design Engineering; and Politics, Philosophy and Economics. To take courses from the Economics or Finance academic departments, students must prove a C1 level proficiency in the language of instruction, Spanish or English.

Academic credits and grading system

A full-time study program consists of 200 to 246 credits. Most courses are worth 4 credits. Each UP credit is equivalent to 14 hours (4 hours of classes per week during 14 weeks of classes). Therefore, a 4-credit course represents 56 hours of classes during one semester.

The workload per semester averages about 16 to 20 credits. The minimum suggested workload for an exchange student is 12 credits.

Grading System: In the Peruvian higher education system, grades go from 0 to 20, 20 being the highest grade and 11 the minimum passing grade.

2. Coming to Peru: What to know

HOUSING OPTIONS

Universidad del Pacífico does not have student dormitories. However, the International Relations Office provides information about suggested accommodation for exchange students in student residencies (private student dorms), family homes, or flats for rent (apartments) in the city.

VISA

Applying for an exchange student visa is mandatory for all incoming students. Each student must gather the documentation previously indicated and submit it to the visa application portal. Each application will be sent to The Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Peru. Once the visa is approved, students will receive a confirmation e-mail. This process takes up to 6 weeks.

HEALTH INSURANCE

All incoming students must have full coverage health insurance during their entire stay in Peru.

3. Short Programs

Universidad del Pacífico offers its students highly rewarding short-term programs abroad, as well as customized programs for partner institutions and other interested educational parties willing to visit our university and the city of Lima.

3.1 Tailor-Made Programs

Universidad del Pacífico offers a variety of choices for study trips in Peru to groups of students, faculty, and administrative staff. Participants will have the opportunity to live a local experience and receive specialized lectures in English by UP faculty. Our professors are recognized academic, responsible leaders in their respective fields and committed to advancing excellence in teaching and research. The program includes lectures, visits to multinational corporations based in Peru and NGOs. The participants will be integrated into the Peruvian culture through language, cuisine and other cultural activities. Tailor-made programs can be coordinated at any time of the year to accommodate to visitors' needs.

3.2 Faculty Led Program

Faculty-led programs are academic optative courses that combine traditional classroom learning with experiential learning abroad. They are short-term courses for Universidad del Pacífico's students, where the professor and the students work on the discipline and visit a specific country, based on the theory learned. The study trip part of the FLP comprises academic and cultural activities for our students as well as field trips to important corporations and institutions. These programs are beneficial both to our students and faculty, with an enormous impact on their professional and personal development.
