STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM

Languages	Spanish. English: Courses available in Management, Economics, Engineering, Marketing, and International Business.
Spanish Language Requirements	While an official language certificate is not mandatory, we strongly recommend a B2 level of Spanish proficiency (written and spoken).
Exchange Students	Undergraduate and graduate students (graduate students may be required to enroll in undergraduate-level courses).
Eligibility	Students must be selected and nominated by their home university to participate in the student exchange program.
Number of Exchange Students	As established in the bilateral agreement. This number may be increased upon prior coordination with Universidad de Lima.
Maximum Exchange Period	Students may participate in the exchange program at Universidad de Lima for a period of up to one academic year.

COURSE WORKLOAD

3-4 hours per week (class hours).
Attendance is **mandatory**.



STANDARD NUMBER OF SEMESTERS TO COMPLETE A BACHELOR'S DEGREE

- Students must complete 209 credits in 10 semesters (5 years).
- Students who pursue the Law Program must complete 257 credits in 6 years.
- Students who pursue the Psychology Program must complete 237 credits in 6 years.



CREDIT SYSTEM

One Ulima credit is equivalent to one hour of theoretical class or two hours of practical class per week throughout the semester. The semester has 14 weeks of classes.

Each course is worth 2–6 Ulima credits, depending on its complexity. Please note that Ulima credits are not the same as ECTS credits. Some European institutions apply the following equivalence: 1 Ulima credit = 1.5 ECTS.



GRADING SYSTEM

The grading system ranges from 0 to 20. Any grade below 11 is considered a failing grade.

ISSUANCE OF TRANSCRIPTS

Transcripts are sent to students about one week after the end of the semester.



ACADEMIC ADVISING

An academic advisor will guide students through the course selection process during enrollment. Course changes (add, switch, or drop) are only allowed during the **first week of classes**.

HEALTH INSURANCE INFORMATION

Mandatory Health Insurance

Before arriving in Peru, students must submit a copy of their international health insurance policy, issued in their home country, covering the entire duration of their exchange period (from the arrival date in Lima until their return to their home country).

The policy must include outpatient care, hospitalization, and repatriation of remains, with direct billing available at private clinics in Peru. It must also clearly state the coverage dates.

Students must request a list of affiliated private clinics in Peru from their insurance provider and upload it to the Mobility Online platform.

VISA INFORMATION

Universidad de Lima will process the official exchange visa for students through the Peruvian Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

In order to start the process, exchange students must upload the information below to the Mobility Online platform **60 days before their arrival in Lima**:

- Air ticket (round trip)
- Statement of solvency to travel to Peru (downloadable from Mobility Online)
- International health insurance
- List of Peruvian clinics available to students during their stay
- Accommodation address in Lima

Students will be notified when the visa is ready (one or two weeks before arriving in Lima), so they can pick it up at the nearest Peruvian Embassy or Consulate. Please visit <http://www.consulado.pe/paginas/Inicio.aspx> to find the Peruvian Consulate in your country.

Important:

To extend their stay for another semester, students must email uce_intercambio@ulima.edu.pe to begin the visa renewal process. Additionally, if students plan to leave the country during their study period, they must inform the Immigration Officer and specify that they hold a Peruvian study visa granted by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs—valid for re-entry into Peru. Students must confirm this information.

ACCOMMODATION

As on-campus housing is not available at Universidad de Lima, students may choose from the list of accommodation options attached to the Mobility Online application form. Assistance is available upon request.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

PALS PROGRAM

Each international student will be supported before and during their exchange by a PALS partner, who will assist with their cultural and academic integration. The program includes help with course registration and guidance on using the Ulima App and the Blackboard platform.

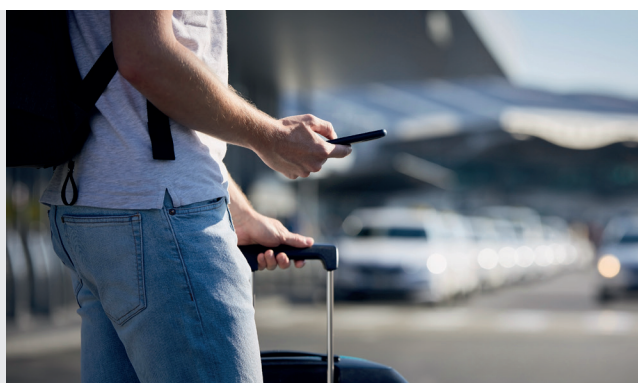
Objectives:
