



# Endicott College of International Studies Fact Sheet for 2021

### **About Endicott College of International Studies**

Endicott College of International Studies (ECIS), founded in 2017, is one of the rising colleges in South Korea, where all classes are taught in English. ECIS offers both undergraduate and graduate degree programs in management and technology. ECIS's mission is to educate students to develop innovative solutions to key management, technology, and international issues around the world.

The following 4-year programs are available at the Bachelor level:

- Global Convergence Management
- Technology Studies

The following Master's degree programs can be completed in 1.5 year, but not sooner than one year:

- Master of Arts in International Studies
- Master of Arts in Global Management
- Master of Engineering in Artificial Intelligence

The following Doctorate program is available and cannot be completed in less than 2.5 years

- Doctor of Philosophy in Management

Since its establishment in 2017, ECIS has signed more than 25 Memorandums of Understanding (MOU) with universities and schools in more than 15 countries. Among available programs are student and faculty exchange programs, joint research, dual degree, and study abroad programs.

Students are admitted based on past academic achievements and English language performance scores. Newly admitted full-time students may earn up to 70% tuition scholarship based on academic performance (GPA) and English proficiency test scores. The enrolment fee is waived for scholarship recipients.

#### Korea's most international school for practical education

Of its 1,094 students, Endicott College has 20% international students representing over 20 different nationalities from Asia, Central Asia, Russia, Africa, and Europe. 95+% of our faculty members are international professors who hold a Ph.D. degree from prestigious American, European, or Asian universities.

#### An American-style curriculum focusing on Asian expertise

Based on an American curriculum, ECIS delivers an International-focused education with global perspectives. During their studies, students will acquire a thorough knowledge through theory, practical training, and internships for excellence in global employment.





#### **Scholarships**

First-semester <u>Admission</u> scholarships depend on a combination of an English proficiency score (IELTS, TOEFL) and GPA earned at their previous academic institution. For Bachelor's students, the amount ranges from 30% to 70%. For Master's degree and Ph.D. students, scholarships range from 10% to 30%. From the second semester onward, <u>merit-based</u> scholarships depend upon GPA only and are awarded for the following semester. For Bachelor students, if they qualify for a scholarship, the next 5-week semester includes a 16.3% scholarship. Merit-based scholarships apply to one semester.

#### Internships

Bachelor's degree students may elect to complete a 6 – 12-month overseas internship, depending upon the department and other factors related to the student's passport and English proficiency. Qualified students may enjoy paid internships and credits equivalent to those generally earned while studying during a similar period. The School's Career Development Center assists in applying for an internship and related matters (visa, interviews with host properties, etc.). Master's degree students may elect to experience an optional one-year management trainee job placement. Ph.D. students may qualify to teach some undergraduate courses depending upon course availability and student ability.

#### Location

Endicott College of International Studies, <u>Woosong University</u> is located in Daejeon, 55 minutes away from Seoul, by high-speed train. Daejeon is Korea's fifth-largest city and is renowned for being Korea's Silicon Valley with about 30 research and development institutions and 18 universities. Daejeon has the highest concentration of researchers, with more than 7,000 Ph.D. holders living and working in the city. Approximately 1.5 million people live in Daejeon.





## Bachelor's Degree Programs

The Undergraduate degree programs are designed around the completion of eight semesters to earn a Bachelor's Degree (4 years). If students elect to study during two optional 5-week summer and winter semesters each year, they can graduate within 3.5 years. Students have to complete a minimum of 132 credits to graduate. They can choose up to 6 classes per semester for a maximum of 17 credits. Most courses are equivalent to 3 credits (equal to 5 ECTS). All students must complete at least one summer program.

Mandatory English proficiency— a minimum of 5.5 IELTS or TOEFL IBT 61 (or equivalent)

**Previous Academic record** – High School Certificate / 12<sup>th</sup> Grade, minimum 60% (or equivalent). The final academic certificate must be apostilled, depending on the country.

**Proof of finances** – A bank balance equivalent to a minimum of USD 18,000, which is to be in the account for a three to six months period. Transaction history & Letter from the bank with the seal and signature are mandatory for the application.

**Part-time job opportunities** – working part-time is allowed only after completion of the first six months of study in Korea. According to the Korean government regulations, students can work on or outside campus up to 20 hours per week. The Korean immigration department will impose severe penalties on students found working illegally.

**Student Council Assessment** - Student Council is active in promoting various extracurricular activities. Approximately \$270 is requested from each regular full-time student to cover these student activities, excursions, and off-site visits during the four years of study. Some departments include a school jacket and tee-shirts for students. If students do not wish to participate in these events, the payment is optional.

**Residence** – Bachelor's Degree students will share a room with another person in the International Dormitory on campus. Students are required to reside on-campus for at least the first semester. If they wish to live off-campus after that, they may request permission from their Department Chair and the Director of Administration. The dormitory contract includes a requirement for each student to subscribe to at least one meal per day. Additional meals are available in the dormitory cafeteria, or outside.

Language skill acquisition - Regular Bachelor students are required to take basic Korean language courses during the first year. During the second and third years, students may elect to study a language of their choice, including Korean, Chinese, Spanish, French, Vietnamese, Indonesian, and Japanese. Students who wish to remain in Korea for employment are encouraged to learn the Korean language to be successful in the job market.

**Study abroad opportunities** - Students may participate in the exchange, study abroad, and dual degree opportunities with numerous universities in a range of countries. Students can spend one or two semesters elsewhere in places such as the United States, Europe, East, and Southeast Asia.

Exchange, study abroad, and dual degree opportunities at Bachelor level are available with a growing list of prestigious partner universities.

#### Footnotes:

- 1. These costs do not include travel, books, personal expense, additional meals and incidentals.
- 2. The cost of living estimate is for students who remain in the campus dormitories during summer and winter sessions. If they return home, these costs are not applicable.
- 3. The dormitory catering service requires a minimum of one meal per day. Additional meals are available for about \$3 each in the dormitory.
- 4. Remittance fee for inbound wire transfer. Ignore if paid in cash.
- 5. The estimated cost includes two mandatory 15-week semesters and one 5-week semester (Summer Semester in the first year is compulsory). Summer/Winter semesters are optional thereafter.
- 6. Includes two semesters of study minus Enrollment fee plus one year cost of living.
- Tuition costs shown above do not include scholarship deductions.
- Admission scholarships apply for the first semester only. Thereafter Merit scholarships are available.
- Actual costs should not vary from the above estimates by more than 5%.





## **Graduate Degree Programs**

**Master's degree** students need to complete 27 credits to graduate over two years. During regular 15-week semesters, students may take up to three courses for a maximum of 9 credits each semester.

**Doctoral students** may complete the 36 credits required to graduate over a minimum period of 2.5 years (5 regular semesters). During each semester, students can take up to three courses for a maximum of 9 credits. If a student earns 9 credits per semester, the fifth semester can be utilized to complete the thesis. However, the student should begin the required thesis earlier in his/her studies.

Mandatory English proficiency— a minimum of 6 IELTS or TOEFL IBT 79 (or equivalent)

**Previous Academic record** – Applicants for a Master's or Doctorate Degree should have a Bachelor's or a Master's degree, respectively, in a related field. Students should check with the Admissions Director for acceptance. Final academic certificates must be apostilled, depending on the country.

**Residence** – Graduate students are required to live off-campus. The Graduate School Admissions assistant will connect students with a local English-speaking realtor to assist in finding suitable housing. The student will be provided contact information for the realtor to facilitate housing arrangements before arrival if the student wishes. On arrival, graduate students may stay in the international dormitory for a few days while finalizing housing arrangements.

**Financial proof** – A bank balance equivalent to a minimum of USD 18,000, which is to be in the account for at least six months. Transaction history & Letter from the bank with the seal and signature is required for the application.

Work experience – No previous work experience is required.

*Language skill acquisition*. Master's degree and Ph.D. students are not required to take language courses but may take them as an audit class.

- 2. A scholarship of 30% is awarded to all first semester Freshmen, after that, issued according to scholarship matrix.





## Admission Process – step by step

- 1. Register at the online admission site: <a href="https://wsu.embark.com/auth/register">https://wsu.embark.com/auth/register</a>.
- Complete online admissions form and attach requested documents. Students may logout/login at their convenience using a username/password to complete the process. Supporting documents should be submitted entirely by 5 January for Spring, or 30 June for Fall.
  - Submit Proof of English proficiency (IELTS, TOEFL)
    - Bachelor's degree: minimum IELTS 5.5, TOEFL IBT 61
    - Master's degree: IELTS 6.0 or TOEFL IBT 79.
    - Ph.D.: minimum IELTS 6.o or TOEFL IBT 79.
  - Passport ID Page copy (must be valid for at least 6 months)
  - o Personal essay or Statement of Purpose
  - Proof of finances: a bank statement showing a minimum amount of USD 18,000 and a signed bank letter attesting to the balance.
  - Grade transcripts/mark sheets: scanned and certified copies with mandatory English translation are acceptable. Depending upon the country of origin, the documents must be either apostilled or certified by the Korean embassy. Students must show original certificates to admissions on arrival.
  - Diploma/Degree certificate: scanned and validated certificates with mandatory English translation are acceptable. Final degree certificate must be submitted in Apostille form or embassy certified form, depending upon the country of origin.
  - o Recommendation letters: 1 for undergraduate students, 2 for graduate students
  - o Resume / CV: for graduate applicants only
- 3. Schedule an online Skype or other admission interviews with the admissions team
- 4. Verification of documents by the Admissions Department
- 5. Successful candidates are issued a letter of acceptance invoice for payment
- 6. A student should initiate a wire transfer to the university for payment of the invoice quickly to facilitate the application of a visa.
- 7. After receipt of invoice payment, the university will send an official certificate of admission and other documents via DHL Courier to the student for the D-2 visa application.
- 8. After receipt of official documents from the university, a student should immediately apply for a D-2 student visa at the nearest Korean embassy.
- 9. Upon arrival in South Korea, students must present all original documents and certificates for verification. All original documents will be returned to the student after verification.
