A short description of Endicott College of International Studies (ECIS)

Founded in 2017, Endicott College of International Studies is one of the rising colleges in South Korea, where all classes are taught in English. ECIS offers undergraduate, graduate and postgraduate degree programs in business and technology. ECIS's mission is to educate students to develop innovative solutions to key management, technology and international issues around the world.

Korea's most international university campus

Of its 794 students, Endicott College has 20% international students representing 15 different nationalities from Asia, Central Asia and Russia, Southeast Asia, and Europe. 90+% of our faculty members are international professors who hold a PhD degree from prestigious American, European or Asian universities.

An American-style curriculum focusing on Asian expertise

Based on an American curriculum, Endicott College delivers an Asian-focused education with global perspectives. During their studies, students will acquire practical and marketable skills.

Endicott's credit system

Bachelor students need to complete 142 credits to graduate over the period of up to four years (8 semesters) or as few as 3.5 years. Students can take up to six courses per semester for a maximum

amount of 18 credits. Most courses at Endicott are worth 3 credits. In comparison with the ECTS system, 3 credits are equal to 5 ECTS.

Bachelor students have the possibility to graduate faster and complete more credits by attending our Winter and Summer mini-semesters. For each mini-semester, students can take up to two courses and complete a maximum of 6 credits (10 ECTS).

Masters students need to complete 27 credits to graduate over the period of two years. During regular semesters, they can take up to three courses for a maximum of 9 credits. Study courses are not offered during Summer & Winter semesters.

Doctorate students need to complete 36 credits to graduate over the period of 2.5 – 3.0 (5 regular semesters). During regular semesters, they can take up to four courses for a maximum of 9 credits.

Language skills

All courses are taught in English and regular Bachelors students are offered basic Korean language courses the first year and an additional selection of language courses the following years. Endicott College encourages students to acquire a third language upon graduation and get a decisive advantage when entering the job market in Korea, or abroad. Masters students are not required to take language courses.

Study abroad opportunities

Students may participate in exchange, study abroad and dual degree opportunities with numerous universities in a range of countries. Students can spend one or two semesters abroad in places such as the United States, Europe, East and Southeast Asia.

Scholarships

Tuition scholarships are merit-based and depend on a combination of the English score (IELTS, TOEFL IBT) and average GPA. The amount ranges from 30 up to 70%. Scholarships are given for the duration of one semester year for BBA students and one semester for Master's students. Following the first semester, merit-based scholarships are available up to 70% (Bachelors) or 50% (graduate degrees).

Location

Endicott College is located in Daejeon, 50 minutes away from Seoul by high-speed train. Daejeon is Korea's fifth largest city and is renowned for being Korea's Silicon Valley with about 30 research and development institutions. Daejeon has the highest concentration of researchers with more than 7,000 PhD holders living and working in the city.

BACHELOR'S DEGREE PROGRAMS

The Bachelor of Arts in Global Management, International Studies or Technology Management programs are designed around the completion of 7 semesters. Students have to complete 142 credits in order to graduate. They can choose up to 6 courses per semester for a maximum of 18 credits. Most courses at Endicott are valued at 3 credits (equal to 5 ECTS).

In the table below, a typical full semester covering all costs is presented.

Mandatory English proficiency– minimum of 5.5 IELTS or TOEFL IBT 61 (or equivalent)

Previous Academic record – High School Certificate / 12th Grade, minimum 60% (or equivalent)

Cost schedule:

- Enrolment fee: one-time payment for regular or transfer students
- Tuition: full tuition per semester without any scholarship
- Dormitory: double occupancy room, one Daily residence meal is provided
- Student activity: excursions around Korea, clubs and associations

GRADUATE / MASTERS PROGRAMS

The two-year Master of Global Management and International Studies is designed around the completion of 4 main semesters (Fall & Spring). Courses for Summer & Winter are not offered. Students have to complete 27 credits in order to graduate. They can choose up to 4 courses per semester for a maximum of 9 credits. Most courses at Endicott College are worth 3 credits.

Mandatory English proficiency– minimum of 6.0 IELTS or TOEFL IBT 79 (or equivalent)

Previous Academic record – Bachelor degree, Minimum 60% (or equivalent)

Ph.D. Programme

The 2.5-year Doctor of Global Management program is designed around the completion of 5 main semesters (Fall & Spring). Students have to complete 36 credits in order to graduate.

Mandatory English proficiency– minimum of 6.0 IELTS or TOEFL IBT 78 (or equivalent)

Previous Academic record – Master degree, Minimum 60% (or equivalent)

Work experience – applicants for the PhD program do not need a work experience.

Other important information

Proof of finances – According to the Korean government regulations, all **degree-seeking** international students must show proof of finances with a bank certificate with a minimum equivalent of \$18,000 USD (or equivalent). Proof of finances does not apply to non-degree seeking (exchange or study abroad) students.

Early graduation - Endicott offers the possibility for students to graduate within 3.5 years for the bachelor's program. Students can take up to two courses during Winter and Summer mini-semesters and complete 6 credits. Mini-semesters last six weeks each and each course is taught in a block of three consecutive weeks.

Scholarships - tuition fees shown in the tables are full tuition fees. **Tuition scholarships are available and merit-based** on the English score and academic GPA, and may range from 30 to 70%. They are awarded for the duration of one semester for bachelor's students and one semester for master's and doctorate students. Scholarships are renewable depending on the student's academic performance. Scholarships do not include stipend.

Accommodation - the school policy requires Bachelor level students to stay at the residence provided by Woosong University for their first semester in South Korea. Bachelor students share a double bedroom. Accommodation for Masters and Doctorate students will be provided separately after their arrival on campus. Following the completion of their first semester, Bachelor level students will have the option to choose their accommodation and live off-campus.

Daily Residence meal - is provided at the school residence for Bachelor students. The daily residence meal may be selected as breakfast, lunch or dinner and is a compulsory component for accommodation.

General living expenses - meals in South Korea are generally very affordable. Meals at the school cafeteria cost around 4 USD (3 euros). Meals outside campus may range from 5 to 12 euros. Personal expenses depend upon the student's lifestyle. The school recommends students to plan monthly living expenses around USD 350 – 400 (about 325 – 375 euros).

Expenses for the initial week in South Korea - some additional payments around USD 300 might be needed during the first week in Korea (airport shuttle bus, medical check-up, personal care products, residence security card, local ID card registration, etc...).

Part-time job opportunities - working part-time is allowed for degree-seeking students after the completion of the first semester. According to the Korean government's regulations, students can work on or outside campus up to 20 hours a week. Students who work illegally will be severely dealt with by Korean immigration services.

Admission Process – step by step

1. **Submission of online application** via the admission link (<https://wsu.embark.com/auth/register>), with all supporting documents, by **Saturday, Friday 5th January 2019**:
 - Endicott College online admissions application form to be filled out
 - Proof of English proficiency (IELTS, TOEFL)
 - Bachelors language requirements: minimum IELTS 5.5, TOEFL IBT 61
 - Masters language requirements: IELTS 6.0 or equivalent
 - PhD language requirements: minimum IELTS 6.0 or equivalent
 - Passport copy ,
 - Personal essay or scholarship essay (if students apply for scholarship)
 - Proof of finances: bank statement with a minimum amount of USD 18,000
 - Grade transcripts: scanned and certified copies with mandatory English translation are acceptable. Upon admission, students will be required to bring original certificates to Endicott
 - Degree certificate: scanned and certified certificates with mandatory English translation are acceptable. Upon admission, students will be required to bring original certificates to Endicott
 - Resume / CV: for Masters and PhD applicants only
2. **Online scheduling of a Skype admission interview** with our Admissions Manager
3. **Verification of documents** by our Admissions Department
4. **Issuance of an acceptance letter and payment invoice** with a deadline upon admission
5. **Sending of invitation and guarantee letters** for the visa application after fee payment is made through wire transfer. **The D2 visa is the only eligible visa for international students in Korea.**
6. Upon arrival to South Korea, students are kindly asked to show in all original documents and certificates that were furnished for the admissions process.
