General Requirements

- <u>Bachelor level students</u>: One year of completed university studies within business administration, economics, informatics, law, or political science for bachelor level students
- Master level students: The equivalency of a bachelor's degree of at least 3 years (180 ECTS credits)

Note: All students must fulfil the prerequisites of each chosen course. When signing the JU Course Confirmation the home institution certifies that the student fulfils the prerequisites for each chosen course and language skills.

Language Requirements

Although language test scores are not formally required, all students are expected to meet minimum **English** requirements. The home institution is responsible for insuring the fluency in English of the students. Students without the adequate level of English run the risk of failing the courses.



Grading System

JIBS uses a grading scale that runs from A to FX. The grades A, B, C, D, and E are all passing grades.



Full-time load per semester: 30 ECTS credits (equivalent to 30 Swedish credits for higher education)

Study Levels

Bachelor level (first cycle)	
G1N	Has only upper-secondary level entry requirements
G1F	Has less than 60 credits in first cycle courses as entry requirements
G1E	Contains specially designed degree project of Higher Education diploma
G2F	Has at least 60 credits in first cycle courses as entry requirements
G2E	Has at least 60 credits in first cycle courses as entry requirements, contains degree project for Bachelor of Arts/Bachelor of Science

Master level (second cycle)	
A1N	Has only first cycle course(s) as entry requirements (Bachelor's Degree)
A1F	Has second cycle course(s) as entry requirements.
A1E	Contains degree project for Master of Arts/Master of Science (60 credits)
A2E	Contains degree project for Master of Arts/Master of Science (120 credits)

Support for Students with Disabilities

Practical Matters

Visa Requirements:

All students should have a valid passport for the period of their study in Jönköping. The visa requirement depends on the nationality of the student.



Health Insurance:

Exchange students admitted at JU receive a supplementary health insurance, which covers the students' medical treatment costs in Sweden. Since the insurance is for emergencies only, students are recommended to purchase a separate insurance of their own.



Note: Regarding medical care and dental care cover, this insurance does not apply for: Citizens of a Nordic country, EU/EEA country, Switzerland, or other country with which a convention regarding medical benefits exists. In these instances, the insured person must have an EU card or similar from their home country. Students will be expected to pay the same health care fees as Swedish residents.

Accommodation:

JU guarantees accommodation for international students. Students need to pay a non-refundable application fee of 700 SEK in order to complete the accommodation application



Student Life:

The JU Student Union arranges different extracurricular activities for students such as the buddy program, host family, trips, cultural events, sports, among others.



Cost of Living:

Approximately 8500 SEK. See estimation of <u>living expenses in Sweden</u>

Note: All students (including incoming exchange students) need to pay the Student Union fee (approximately 330 SEK per semester)

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
