JU has a designated Student Health Care Service which is free of charge. If you are feeling anxious and need someone to talk to, or are worried about a health issue and not sure how to navigate the Swedish Health Care system, then pay the team a visit and they will be happy to support and guide you. Don't forget, as an exchange student you are covered by JU's **emergency health insurance.**

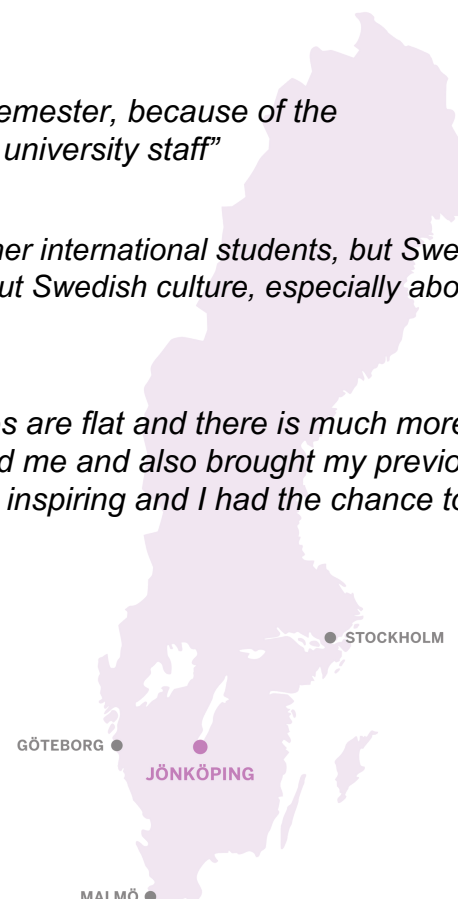

How does the process work?

1

Approach your home university's International Office about a nomination. Jönköping University is made up of 4 main schools. Your home university will have an agreement with one or more of the schools and according to the agreement, you will be nominated to a single school.

- School of Engineering (JTH)
- School of Health and Welfare (HHJ)
- School of Education and Communication (HLK)
- Jönköping International Business School (JIBS)

After Jönköping University has reviewed your nomination, you will receive an email with instructions to complete your online application by the deadline. This is when you will...

- Choose courses from your JU school Apply for accommodation
- Complete personal data Upload required documentation
- Receive your Letter of Acceptance and Insurance Certificate

Complete the steps in your accommodation application by announcing your arrival and attend the 'Online Pre-arrival Meeting' organised by JU's International Office.
