WORKLOAD

Courses in the engineering programs are full-time and offered Monday to Saturday, with most courses between Monday and Friday. A typical MSB student takes 30 ECTS credits per term, which is 5-7 courses. Course contact hours run between 1 and 4 hours per week depending on their credit value. The limit of MSB credits for exchange students is 30 ECTS. This limit may be changed based on approval from the Program Director at MSB and the student's home institution.

COURSES

- Courses: Undergraduate & MBM courses will be made available at student application stage. The SMU International Programs Office will provide course catalogues with the welcome email.
- Note: MSB will endeavor to find exchange students places in all courses that they wish to enroll in. Enrollment is finalized upon arrival at MSB.

ASSESSMENT

Each course evaluation includes participation, examinations, and various at-home and in-class assignments.
 Ongoing courses have no midterm or final exam during exam periods.
 These includes most courses in the COM and LIB discipline. Exam courses have a formal midterm and final exam which account for 70% of the total grade; exams are not offered for these courses outside of designated exam periods, and there is no re-sit period for examinations.
 Grading Scale: MSB uses the A-F system with the minimum passing grade a C.

LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION

✓ All MSB courses are taught in English. Language Requirements: TOEFL 75(iBT) / IELTS 6 / CAE /CPE, or an English Language Waiver from you home institution. Other Language Courses: Students who wish to study Arabic (MSA or Tunisian) or French may contact the Language and Culture Institute at SMU (http://www.lci.tn) to arrange for courses. While these languages are not required for interactions at MSB, they can help facilitate life in Tunisia, as well as cultural enrichment.

STUDENT LIFE

- When you arrive on campus at the beginning of your semester you will participate in an orientation session. SMU has a variety of extracurricular activities and clubs.
- Accommodation : Students must notify SMU in advance if they require assistance with finding housing. There is no oncampus housing, but there are a variety of opportunities off- campus. In general, SMU recommends incoming students look for housing around Lac II or L'Aouina, or in the Northern Suburbs, including Sidi Bou Said, La Marsa, and Carthage.
- Living Expenses: Student expenses are linked to their living situation and their own budgeting. Make sure to check the exchange rate of the Tunisian Dinar before traveling, as it can fluctuate - typically to the advantage of other currencies. Cost varies significantly in Tunis, depending on your choice of neighborhood and activities:
- Accommodation 500 - 1500 TND/month 200 - 500 €/month
- Meals 450 TND/month 150 €/month
- Books and Supplies
 Transportation 25 TND/month **Ω** €/month
 - (bus, taxi) 200 TND/month 60 €/month
- Leisure 250 TND/month 80 €/month
