Royal Birmingham Conservatoire applicants

Students looking to apply to Royal Birmingham Conservatoire require nomination via EASY system. Details of the required online application(s) will be shared following the acceptance of a nomination. The supporting documents are required as well as a supporting statement.

Applicants to Royal Birmingham Conservatoire must prepare an audition or portfolio. Please visit <u>our website</u> for Audition and Portfolio guidance.

BCU English Proficiency Test

Students who do not hold an English language qualification that is accepted by Birmingham City University, can consider the Birmingham City University English Proficiency Test (BCU EPT) to demonstrate their English ability.

Fees

If you apply to study at Birmingham City University on a Study Abroad programme, the fee includes tuition, examination costs and membership of the Students' Union. The fees are:

Study Abroad for One Semester: £6,990 Study Abroad for Two Semesters: £13,980

Students from our partner institutions who participate in an exchange programme may have their tuition fee waived. Please contact your home university for further details.

Available programmes

You can find a full list of our courses on our website.

International students are required to take a full-time study load for visa purposes as follows:

One Semester students: 60 modules required (3-4 modules per semester)

Full Academic Year students: 120 modules required (6-8 modules for the academic year)

We recommend that students take modules from within one College. The module selection process will be carried out during the application process.

Transcripts

All credit-bearing Study Abroad students will be issued with a transcript detailing their modules and final grades at the end of the academic year. This will be emailed directly to students and to the partner university upon request.

Visa and immigration requirements

If you are coming to the UK as a student you may need to obtain a visa before travelling. Find out if you need a visa by visiting www.gov.uk/check-uk-visa.

Current estimated cost of living*

According to the UK's National Union of Students (NUS), the average annual cost of living in England (outside of London) for students is £12,276**. Most students will spend around £150 (~US\$180) per month on food and groceries, or £1,350 (~US\$1,660) per academic year
