How to apply

1. If you are a student at one of our partner universities, your home university will firstly need to send a nomination to studyabroadatBCU@bcu.ac.uk.
2. Complete online application(s) before the deadline including all the documents needed (please see below).
3. We will let you know when your application has been accepted and when we may need further details from you.

Supporting documents checklist:

- Passport copy (photo page only)
- Academic transcript from your home university in English
- English language qualification. Generally an IELTS of 6.0 overall (with no band below 5.5), please note that some courses may require a higher IELTS score - for more information, please see www.bcu.ac.uk/english-tests
- Module information from your home university for Computing, Engineering and the Built Environment courses
- Portfolio/sample of your work for Arts, Design and Media courses.

PLEASE NOTE: all documents should be provided in English.

Royal Birmingham Conservatoire applicants

Students applying to Royal Birmingham Conservatoire firstly require nomination. Details of the required online application will be shared following the acceptance of a nomination.

As well as the supporting documents above, Royal Birmingham Conservatoire students must also provide:

- a supporting statement.
- an audition or portfolio. Applicants should upload their audition videos to a platform like YouTube or Vimeo. If they are uploading a portfolio, they can use platforms like SoundCloud, Spotify, Google Drive etc. Links to the audition video or portfolio should be included in the written statement as part of the online application. BCU English Proficiency Test

Students who do not hold an English language qualification accepted by Birmingham City University, can take the Birmingham City University English Proficiency Test (BCU EPT) to demonstrate their English ability.

Application deadlines

One Semester (Autumn) or Full Year for September entry

Nomination deadline: 16 March
Application deadline*: 1 April

One Semester (Spring) for January entry

Nomination deadline: 14 September
Application deadline*: 1 October

* We cannot guarantee consideration of applications submitted after the above deadlines, although we will try to consider every application where possible.

Royal Birmingham Conservatoire Applications All applicants (One Semester or Full Year)

Nomination deadline: 1 March
Application deadline: 31 March

Fees

- Study Abroad for one semester: £8,845
- Study Abroad for two semesters (full year): £17,690

The fees include tuition, examination costs and membership to BCU Students' Union.

Students from our partner institutions who participate in an exchange programme may have their tuition fee waived. Please contact your home university for further details.

Modules (Classes)

- One semester students must take 60 BCU credits (30 ECTS) = 3-4 modules per semester
- Two semester students (full year) must take 120 BCU credits (60 ECTS) = 6-8 modules per semester

You can find a list of example modules on our [website](#). The module selection process occurs after you have applied. We recommend that you take modules from within one college.

Transcripts

All credit-bearing students are issued with a transcript showing their modules and final grades, at the end of the academic year. This is emailed directly to students, and to the partner university upon request.

Visa and immigration requirements

If you are coming to the UK as a student you may need to obtain a visa before travelling. Find out if you need a visa by visiting www.gov.uk/check-uk-visa.

Accommodation

University Halls of Residence
