The successful applicant will receive an offer letter and a student ID number. All additional information will be sent to the student's email address which has been provided in the application form. 3. The student can apply for accommodation with their student ID number which will be included in the official offer letter.

<p>Please see course/modules details below</p>	<p>You can find all information about our University, courses and modules Here</p> <p>Please only nominate Undergraduate/Bachelors students unless we already have an agreement for Postgraduate / Masters students.</p> <p>If you nominate a postgraduate student for our Undergraduate / Bachelors courses they will be rejected unless specifically allowed for in a partnership agreement.</p> <p>If nominating to the School of Nursing, Midwifery, and Health: Clinical placement nominations will only be accepted from partners with whom Coventry University has an explicit arrangement as evidenced in the institutional Erasmus agreement. Nominations without this pre-existing arrangement will be rejected.</p>									
<p>Can students combine courses from different faculties?</p>	<p>Students cannot mix courses from different colleges. For example, the BA Business course and the BA French course belong to two different colleges and therefore cannot be combined.</p>									
<p>Can students combine courses at Undergraduate / Bachelors and Postgraduate / Masters level?</p>	<p>No, unfortunately the two cannot be combined.</p>

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<p>What are the course requirements?</p>	<p><u>English Requirements</u></p> <p>B2 Level of English is required. This can be confirmed by a letter from the student's home university.</p> <p>The letter needs to state that the student has achieved B2 or higher in all four</p>									

components (reading, writing listening and speaking).

The letter must be:

- On Letter headed paper
- Provides contact details for institution
- Dated
- Signed and stamped by the home institution.

Alternatively, the students may provide evidence that they have passed an English language level test. The following tests are acceptable:

Visas and immigration

Visa options:

1. **Standard Visitor Visa** allows students to come to the UK for a short period of time (up to 6 months), such as to participate in an exchange programme. Some nationalities will need to apply in advance for a Standard Visitor Visa. **You cannot extend a visitor visa nor switch into a different visa category in the UK while on a Standard Visitor visa.** Please find a link below to information regarding Standard Visitor Visa: <https://www.gov.uk/standard-visitor-visa>

Important update about Brexit and visas

Please note that visa requirements for students from the EEA and Switzerland, coming to study in the UK have changed since January 2021. Visa required depends on students' length of stay. Students nominated for Semester 1 only will not be able to extend their mobility to Full Academic Year. If you have any students that you are planning to nominate for Semester 1 only that might want to extend their stay, please inform both the Study Abroad team and relevant Faculty by 31st May 2023 as any extensions (from Semester 1 to Full Academic Year) will not be possible after this date.

	If the student has settled/pre settled status , the student is not required to have a visa to enter the UK.

Attendance monitoring	<p>Please note: All students' attendance will be monitored, and all students on the Student Visa route will have attendance/engagement monitored by the International Student Compliance Team (ISC), to ensure they remain compliant with UKVI regulations and visa conditions.</p> <p>Please be aware that you cannot extend your study period (from one semester to full academic year) after your application is completed.</p> <p>For Incoming students: You will need to complete a 'Right to Study' check on arrival in the UK, before you can enrol on your course. This will be carried out by the ISC team who will contact you prior to enrolment to guide you through this process.</p>
