

Where is Sheffield?

Sheffield is England's fifth largest city. It's home to around 500,000 people and 60,000 students.

We're right in the middle of the country, with excellent transport links to other UK cities. We are just two hours from London and one hour from Manchester by train.

We've got everything you need — from one of Europe's biggest shopping centres to theatres, art galleries, music venues and museums. As a multicultural city, you'll find shops, restaurants and speciality supermarkets that sell products and food from all over the world.

60% of Sheffield is made up of green spaces like parks, gardens and countryside. There are plenty of places to relax or explore in the city or nearby Peak District National Park.

Sheffield was voted one of the UK's top ten student cities (Student Crowd 2024). We were also named the best city break in the UK (Time Out, 2024).

What will it cost?

If you're an Erasmus or exchange student, you won't need to pay any additional tuition fees during your time in Sheffield. However, you will need to cover your own accommodation and living costs.

Living costs

Sheffield has a low cost of living compared to other major UK cities, meaning your money will go further. Living costs here are significantly lower than in London.



Your new home

Don't worry about finding somewhere to stay during your time in Sheffield – we've already done it for you! We reserve places for those studying on an exchange within one of our halls of residence.

Most halls are located close to the city centre, so everything Sheffield has to offer will be right on your doorstep and you'll never be short of things to see and do. With great access to public transport, you'll easily be able to explore Sheffield and the surrounding area such as the Peak District.

How to apply

If you'd like to study in Sheffield as part of an exchange, here's your step-by-step guide.

1. Visit our website to find out what modules and routes are available. Exchange students can visit shu.ac.uk/study-here/apply/exchanges.
2. Check that you meet the entry requirements. Speak to your university's exchange coordinator and get their approval for your application. Your home university will need to nominate you officially before you can apply.
3. Find out whether you'll need a student visa, and if so, apply as early as possible.
4. Submit your application to study with us, in plenty of time
 - 31 October for the January intake
 - 31 May for the September intake
5. Apply for your accommodation – details of the halls of residence available and how to apply will be sent with your offer of a place.
