Entry Requirements	Academic Entry Requirements You will need to be a current student in good academic standing at your university, and have completed at least one year of your course. We assess each application individually.
	English Language Requirements for Exchange students All classes are taught in English, therefore students are expected to be proficient in the English language to be capable of understanding, writing reports, making presentations and completing exams.
	English language requirements for Exchange students
	<ul> <li>If you are a student who will study the Erasmus exchange programme for one trimester you will need to provide a letter from your study abroad / exchange / Erasmus+ coordinator or an academic member of staff from your home University stating that your level of English is a minimum of B2 along with any other certification you have. On entry you will currently be required to hold a Standard Visitor Visa.</li> <li>If you are a student who is studying for a full academic year you will need to provide evidence of your English proficiency (ELP). This must be one of these accepted tests. You are required to apply for a student visa before entry to the UK and will be allocated a Certificate of Status only after you have provide sufficient proof of ELP, along with an up to-date passport and reference.</li> </ul>

Opening a bank account	During your first two weeks, you will have the opportunity to open a bank account.
	It is sometimes difficult for students who are studying for up to six months to open an account, however, some banks allows students to open basic or savings accounts.
	There are several different banks to choose from, if you have not already decided. Please visit the banks and select which one you would like to use. If you are arriving in September, you will have the opportunity to meet different bank representatives on campus.
	The International Office will provide you with an introductory letter for opening a bank account. To receive this, you will need to tell them which bank you have chosen.  To open a bank account you will need to show the bank:  • your passport  • your letter of offer to study at the University  • an introductory letter from the Central Hub, Student Central Building

Registering with a GP	If you're moving to Hull, the University requires you to register with a GP.
	All international students (non-EU) who are studying in the UK on a course of study of six months or more, qualify for National Health Service (NHS) treatment from the beginning of their stay, on the same basis as anyone else who is ordinarily resident in the UK. This means that you can access free NHS health care provision, and you can register with an NHS doctor, known in the UK as a General Practitioner (GP). Most GPs work together in groups, known as GP Surgeries.
	You will normally register as an NHS patient with a GP Surgery, rather than with an individual doctor. You should register with a GP surgery as soon as you arrive in the UK, do not wait until you become unwell, as you may not be able to get the health care you need.
	The easiest way to find a GP near you is to visit the NHS Choices website and enter the postcode of your student accommodation, please see <a href="http://www.nhs.uk/Service-Search/GP/LocationSearch/4">http://www.nhs.uk/Service-Search/GP/LocationSearch/4</a>
	You will also have the opportunity to register with a GP during Welcome Week on campus.
Medical Insurance for non-EU students	If you are in the UK for less than 6 months, you must have adequate medical insurance before travelling. You can still register with a GP surgery but will be required to pay for any subsequent consultations or medical treatments.
Visa	Depending on your country of origin, you may need a visa to study in the UK. We will email you with information about visa applications and UK entry documents. The information you receive will depend on the length of your study and modules you have chosen.
