	 If you are a student who will study the exchange programme for <u>one trimester</u> you will need to provide a letter from your study abroad / exchange / Erasmus+ coordinator or an academic member of staff from your home University stating that your level of English is a minimum of B2 along with any other certification you have. On entry you will currently be required to hold a Standard Visitor Visa. If you are a student who is studying for a <u>full academic year</u> you will need to provide evidence of your English Language Proficiency (ELP). This must 	
	be one of these <u>accepted tests</u> . You are required to apply for a student visa before entry to the UK and will be allocated a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) only after you have provide sufficient proof of ELP, along with an up to-date passport and reference.

Opening a bank account

During your first two weeks, you will have the opportunity to open a bank account.

It is sometimes difficult for students who are studying for up to six months to open an account, however, some banks allow students to open basic or savings accounts. The process of opening accounts is lengthy.

There are several different banks to choose from, if you have not already decided. Please visit the banks and select which one you would like to use. If you are arriving in September, you will have the opportunity to meet different bank representatives on campus.

Registering with a GP	If you're moving to Hull, can register with a GP.
	All international students who are studying in the UK on a course of study of six months or more, pay for the National Health Service (NHS) treatment from the beginning of their stay, alongside their visa application. This means that you can access free NHS health care provision, and you can register with an NHS doctor, known in the UK as a General Practitioner (GP). Most GPs work together in groups, known as GP Surgeries.
	You will normally register as an NHS patient with a GP Surgery, rather than with an individual doctor. You should register with a GP surgery as soon as you arrive in the UK, do not wait until you become unwell, as you may not be able to get the health care you need.
	The easiest way to find a GP near you is to visit the NHS Choices website and enter the postcode of your student accommodation, please see http://www.nhs.uk/Service-Search/GP/LocationSearch/4
Medical Insurance	If you are in the UK for less than 6 months, you must ensure you have adequate medical insurance before travelling.
	You can still register with a GP surgery but will be required to pay for any subsequent consultations or medical treatments.
Visa	All students need a visa to enter the UK.
	Single trimester students currently enter the UK on a Standard visitor visa. You will not be permitted to extend your programmes for the full year if you enter on this visa.
	Full academic year students MUST apply for a student visa. This cannot be completed until you have been issued a Certificate of Study (CAS) which is sent by the University admissions team, usually in August annually. We will email you with information about visa applications and UK entry documents once your application is complete and accepted.
