have to pay rent for that term.

Please note that students cannot apply to come for part of a term, e.g. September to

February.

Language requirements

Students whose first language is not English must provide evidence of their English language level as part of their application.

Those who will need a Study Visa to enter the UK, e.g. those who will come to Kent for 6 months or longer, must submit a valid Secure English Language Test certificate. The SELT certificate must be less than 2 years old.

Other requirements

GPA 3.0 (where 4.0 is the highest grade), according to the terms of our agreement with an individual partner.

Law: French students on a postgraduate exchange who wish to take LLM modules must have an average of 12/20 for the licence, and an average mark of 7 in IELTS. LLM students from other countries, please see the <u>entry requirements</u>.

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Module registration

The Study Abroad team will liaise with the academic schools to get students' modules approved and registered. This will be based on the Provisional module registration form which students submit as part of the application. Modules will be registered as far as possible before arrival.

Please note that Kent does not have an "Add and Drop" period.

Official Transcript The University will issue one official electronic transcript to the student's home institution after the Exam Boards have met, in February for those who finished in December and July/August for those who finished in April or June. We can also issue hard copies on request.

A copy of the grading system is included in the transcript.
