English Language requirements	Until the end of the transition period on 31 December 2020, EU/EEA nationals will still be able to travel to the UK as normal. EU/EEA students who start their study in Sheffield before this date, do not need to provide proof of their English language in their application. We would encourage them to upload any certificates they do have. After 01 January 2021, all students may be required to provide evidence of their English language proficiency for a visa. Further information about this will be communicated once it is known. Students not from the EU/EEA will need to provide proof of their English language at application stage. Extending stay	If a student comes to Sheffield for the Autumn semester only, and then decides they wish to extend their stay to the full year, they must apply to Global Opportunities & Exchanges by 01 November . We will assess the current balance of students for inbound and outbound students, and will let them know. Students will not be allowed to extend their stay if they apply after this deadline.

Application process	 Students must be nominated by their home university via our online form. We do not accept email nominations. Partners are asked to nominate students by the above deadlines to allow students time to submit their application. If the nomination is in line with our exchange agreement, students receive a link to the online application form along with instructions on how to complete it. Students must provide an up to date copy of their transcript, translated in to English, as part of their application. Once students are accepted, they receive an email confirmation containing their applicant number. The applicant number allows students to apply for University accommodation and
Housing information	complete pre-registration steps. Students can apply online for University owned accommodation once they have received their applicant number. University housing is only be guaranteed for students studying in Sheffield for the full academic year.
