Module restrictions	With the exception of students coming to Sheffield via a Modern Languages exchange agreement, those who are hosted by the School of Languages and cultures, students can only choose modules from their host academic department in the application system. Students must select 120 Sheffield credits (60 ECTS) for a full academic year or 60 Sheffield credits (30 ECTS) for one semester. Students will be able to view all available modules in their online application.

English Language requirements	<p>From the 2021/22 academic year, all exchange student not from an English speaking country are required to provide evidence of their English language proficiency at application stage. Nomination deadlines	<p>Autumn entry: 01 June 2021 Spring entry: 01 October 2021</p>
Student application deadlines	<p>Autumn entry: 30 June 2021 Spring entry: 30 October 2021</p>
Extending stay	<p>If a student comes to Sheffield for the Autumn semester only, and then decides they wish to extend their stay to the full year, they must apply to Global Opportunities & Exchanges by 01 November.</p> <p>We will assess the current balance of students for inbound and outbound students, and will let them know. Extensions are not automatically granted, and can't be granted by the host department.</p> <p>Students will not be allowed to extend their stay if they apply after the 01 November deadline.</p>
Application process	<p>1. Students must be nominated by their home university via our online form. We do not accept email nominations. Partners are asked to nominate students by the above deadlines to allow students time to submit their application.</p> <p>2. If the nomination is in line with our exchange agreement, students receive a link to the online application form along with instructions on how to complete it. Students must provide an up to date copy of their transcript, translated in to English, as part of their application.</p>

	<p>3. Once students are accepted, they receive an email confirmation containing their applicant number. The applicant number allows students to apply for University accommodation and complete pre-registration steps.</p>
Housing information	<p>Students can apply online for University owned accommodation once they have received their applicant number.
