| Nomination & Application deadlines | Student nominations should be sent by e-mail by September 15 for spring and April 1 for fall & academic year exchange |
| | Students should complete their applications by October 15 for spring and May 1 for fall & academic year exchange |
| Academic Courses | Students can view courses in two ways: |

| | Students must meet prerequisites for the ECU classes they wish to take. In some cases, students must also need permission from the department in which they are trying to take classes as spaces can be limited for the following academic departments: Engineering, Music, Construction Management, Computer Science, Theatre, Dance, Art |

| Transcript of grades | An official transcript will be mailed or e-mailed to the home university International Office within one month of the exchange program end date |
| Accommodations | Exchange students are required to live on campus. Spaces are reserved for exchange students and exchange students must sign a contract. After official acceptance, exchange students will be given information on how to sign this contract online. |
| | Typically, exchange students are housed in White Hall in the West End Neighborhood, which was renovated in 2018. Students are housed in double rooms with an American roommate. |

| Dining & Meal Plans | Meal plans are required for students who live on campus. Students will have unlimited access to the two dining halls on campus during business operations. There are several food places on campus where you can use your meal plan. To view more information about food options or meal plans, please go to www.dining.ecu.edu |
| Visa & Immigration | Exchange students will attend ECU on a J-1 exchange visa. Upon acceptance into ECU, students will receive a DS-2019 and official acceptance letter. Upon receipt, students will need to pay the SEVIS Fee and schedule an appointment with the closest US Embassy or Consulate. |
| Health Insurance & Immunizations | The J-1 visa requires that you have minimum health insurance premiums. Proof of insurance will be required upon arrival. If insurance policy does not meet the minimum requirement, you can purchase and enroll into an appropriate plan approved by the UNC System. |
| | The State of North Carolina requires that all students have specific immunizations. You can view immunization requirements on the North Carolina State Law Immunizations Requirements website. |
| | The TB test must be administered in North America. During orientation, students will receive the TB test as well as any other missing immunizations. |
| Orientation and arrival | New international students must attend orientation. Orientation is held the week before classes and specific information will be detailed in the acceptance letter. |
| | Transportation from the airport is provided on specific dates. Depending on the airport, there may be a fee associated with it. Information will be included upon acceptance. |
| Resources | Our office has created an International Student Hub, which is hosted on the Canvas platform. Students will be registered for the hub after admittance and will have access throughout their exchange program. |
