DEADLINES

	Nomination	Student Application
Fall Term	April 1	May 1
Spring Term	September 1	October 1

ELIGIBILITY

*3.0 GPA equivalent

*Refer to the exchange agreement for specific eligibility.

NOTE:

Students who wish to study in the Naveen Jindal School of Management (JSOM) must have taken calculus courses, as nearly all JSOM courses list calculus as a prerequisite.

Incoming Exchange Process

NOMINATION



The home university will submit the student nomination to UT Dallas before the semester deadline via this [nomination form](#). The corresponding UT Dallas academic department will review and approve the nomination.

APPROVED

If approved, the student will be emailed by our office and asked to complete the online admissions application and submit additional documents (official transcript in English and original language, [official English proficiency exam score](#), degree certificate (if graduate student), etc.)



ADMITTED



If admitted, the student will:

- Apply for on-campus housing.
- Be contacted by the International Students and Scholars Office for additional documentation to issue the DS-2019 (financial documents, passport, request form, etc.)
- Register for international student orientation:
icp.utdallas.edu/international-student-orientation
- Must receive a meningitis vaccination if under 22 years of age.
This can be obtained overseas. See details:

Upon receipt of the DS-2019, the student will obtain a US visa and make travel arrangements. Upon indication, students should work on course registration with their assigned academic advisor at UTD (according to their major) so that they may enroll in courses before arrival at UTD. Courses are subject to availability.

Immigration

Exchange students coming to the US to study must apply for a J-1 visa and will need a DS-2019 from UT Dallas.



Semester Dates/Timeline

	Fall	Spring
First day of class	August 25, 2025	January 20, 2026
Recommended date of arrival/move-in to housing	August 20, 2025	Mid-week prior to start of classes
Recommended date of orientation	August 22, 2025	Week before start of classes
Last day of final exams	December 19, 2025	May 15, 2026
Last day to move out of housing	Day after last day of final exams	Day after last day of final exams

It is recommended that students arrive the week before the start of classes to take care of necessary steps upon arrival. A typical schedule of the first week on campus is:

Day 1: Arrival, move-in to housing, take TB test if possible

Day 2-3: Attend the international student orientation, J-1 Exchange student orientation, submit any required admissions documents, purchase items for housing, meet with academic advisor if course schedule is still need to be finalized

Day 4: Get student ID and DART pass, pay fees, attend welcome events and other campus activities, start courses

Insurance

Every international student is required to have health insurance. The majority of international students must take the university's health insurance plan, which costs approximately \$1,700 per semester. Waivers can be requested for students who bring government-sponsored health insurance plans that meet coverage requirements and request a waiver before the deadline. NOTE: Waivers are not guaranteed and very rarely granted as requirements are specific and not managed internally by the Office of International Education but is rather mandated by the University of Texas System.

Fees

Generally, exchange students must pay the following fees:

Exchange Application and Foreign Credential Fee	\$150
International Student Fee	\$150
International Orientation Fee	\$50
Health Insurance Fee	\$1,700 (approx.)
Transcript Fee	\$10 (end of semester)
Housing (Application Fee required)	Cost varies

Course Information

Students may choose any open classes that they are eligible for in the course book coursebook.utdallas.edu

There is a wide variety of courses available for both undergraduate and graduate students. All students must meet any prerequisite requirements. Undergraduate students are generally not permitted to take graduate courses.

All international students must be registered in a full course of study (12 credits for undergraduates, 9 credits for graduates). Exchange students cannot register until open enrollment begins. Students must have removed the holds on their account (TB test, international orientation, meningitis vaccine, etc.) in order to register.

Although we offer a wide variety of courses, there are some courses which are in **high demand** (especially courses in the school of Engineering and Computer Science). We recommend students have flexibility and consider additional courses in case their first options are not available.
