VALUE

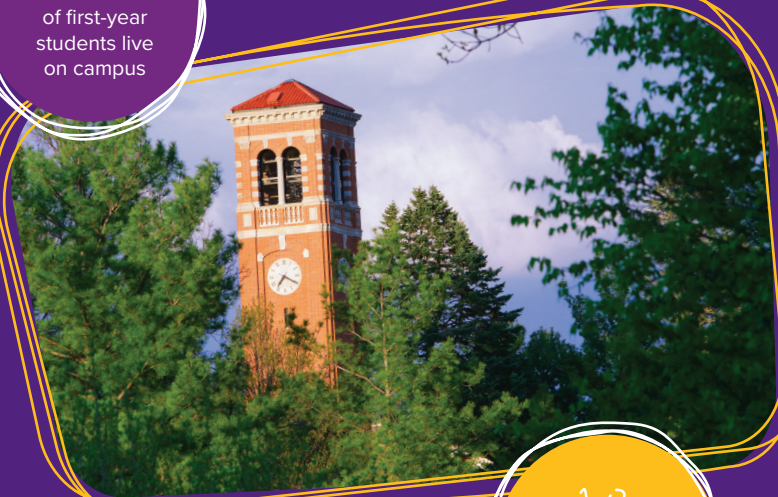
Residence hall rooms are furnished and include utilities, wireless internet and laundry.

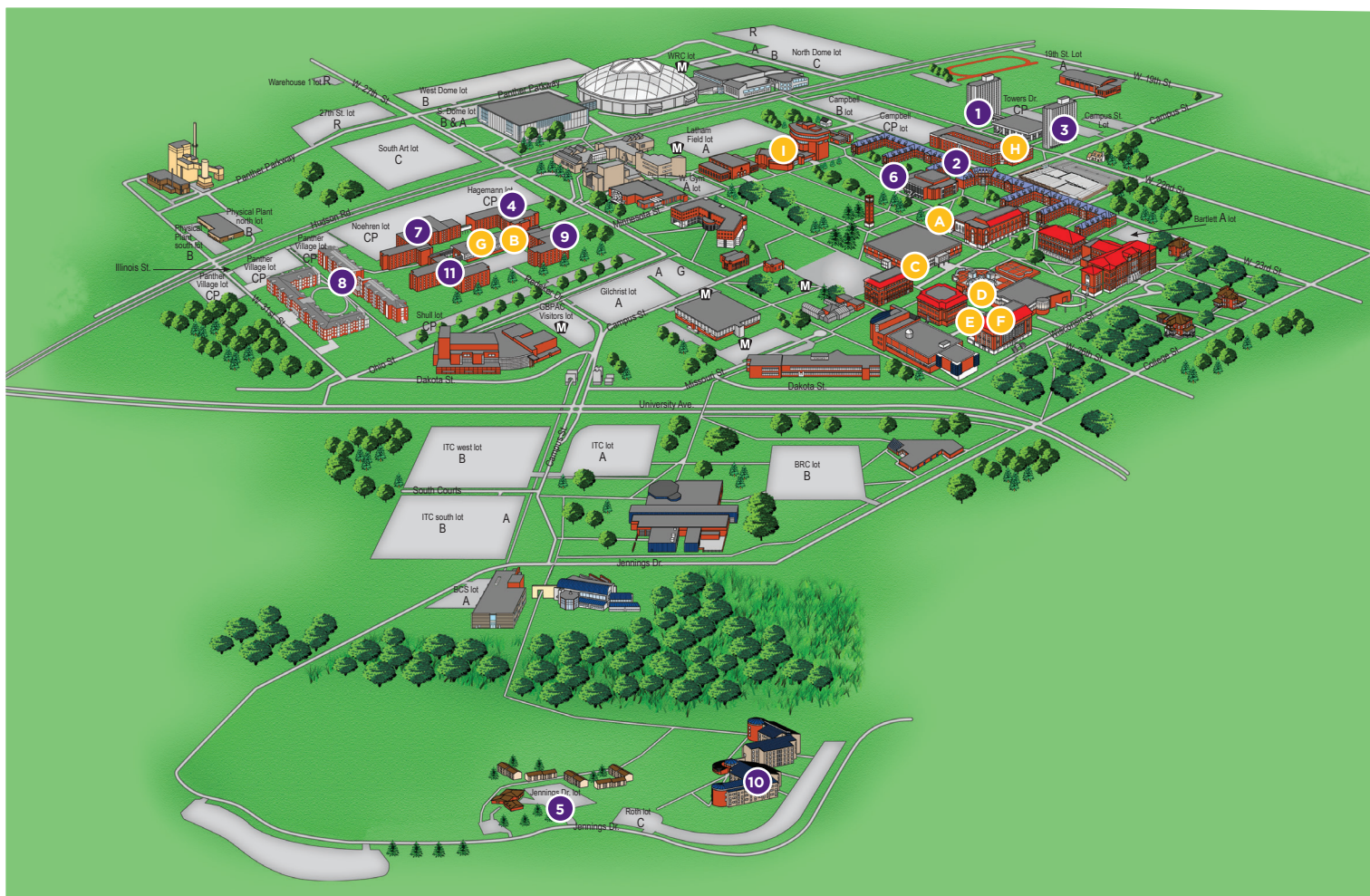
