

Application Process

Step 1: Exchange students are nominated by their institution via an online form sent out to partners.

Step 2: Nominated students are emailed the application link and instructions.

Required Application Documents:

- Academic Transcript (officially translated in English)
- Passport ID Page
- Proof of English language proficiency (as appropriate)
- · Personal Statement

GPA Requirement: 3.0 or equivalent at home institution

Language Requirement: 79 TOEFL iBT, 110 Duolingo, or 6.5 llets

Post admission, students are required to complete their health history form, course registration, and obtain a DS2019 to apply for a J-1 visa.



Housing and Meal Plans

Students are encouraged to live on campus.

USF Education Abroad will assist students with on campus housing arrangements.

Meal plans are available for all students living on or off campus.

- Psychology and College of Arts coursework are only available for registration at the end of semester. Coursework in these fields is limited.





Registration Information

Before orientation, the inbound exchange coordinator registers students in their requested classes and works with departments and colleges across campus to facilitate registration.

After students attend orientation, they may register for classes and change their schedule.

Students will need to submit at least 8 class courses per semester for registration purposes.

Students should only use the **dynamic course search function** to search for classes that are offered each semester.

The inbound exchange coordinator will facilitate the approval process for all classes.

During the students first semester there are two compliance related holds (listed below) that prevent registration. It is important students work to resolve both holds quickly to ensure registration in their desired classes.

Immunization and Insurance Compliance Restrictions

Immunization Course Restriction Attribute (IMMN): Students have not met immunization compliance requirements.

SI Hold: The Health Insurance Agreement has not been completed and submitted.



Estimated Costs

Approximate living cost per semester

o Undergraduate: \$11,180

o Graduate: \$11,292

 Tuition and fees are waived as part of the exchange agreement.

Approximated costs include:

o Housing and meals

Books and supplies

o Entertainment, general living expenses, and travel

o Mandatory health insurance

Per U.S. regulations, immigration and university policy, all exchange student on a J-1 visa are required to have medical insurance. Students can either purchase USF health insurance or an accepted non - USF medical insurance.

Exchange Students will enter the United States on J-1 visas

United States visa requirements vary depending upon the country of origin, please check with your local embassy or consulate.

Exchange Student Orientation

Held on the Thursday prior to the semester start date.

Students must arrive at least one day prior to the orientation date.
