Application Process

Step 1: Exchange students are nominated by their institution via an online form sent out to partners.

Step 2: Nominated students are emailed the application link and instructions.

Required Application Documents:

- Academic Transcript (officially translated in English)
- Passport ID Page
- Proof of English language proficiency (as appropriate)
- Personal Statement

GPA Requirement: 2.5 for Undergraduates, 3.0 for Graduates (or equivalent at home institution)

Language Requirement: 79 TOEFL iBT, 110 Duolingo, or 6.5 IELTS

Post admission, students are required to complete their health history form, course registration, and obtain a DS2019 to apply for a J-1 visa.

Housing and Meal Plans

Students are encouraged to live on campus.

<u>USF International Student Support</u> will assist students with on campus housing arrangements.

Registration Information

Students will be provided with registration instructions prior to arrival to campus.

The inbound exchange coordinator will provide students with instructions for finding courses offered in the semester of attendance.

Students must be able to provide least 8 class courses per semester for registration purposes.

The inbound exchange coordinator will facilitate the approval process for all classes.

During the students first semester there are two compliance related holds (listed below) that prevent registration. It is important students work to resolve both holds quickly to ensure registration in their desired classes.

Immunization and Insurance Compliance Restrictions

Immunization Course Restriction Attribute (IMMN): Students have not met immunization compliance requirements.

SI Hold: The Health Insurance Agreement has not been completed and submitted.
