The University of Northern Iowa (UNI) provides a high-quality study abroad experience in the heartland of the United States. UNI is ranked No. 2 in U.S. News and World Report's "America's Best Colleges," Best Regional Universities (Midwest) category for public universities.

Orientation: Orientation occurs the week before classes start and is mandatory for all exchange students. This is when students will register for courses at UNI. More information on orientation can be found here: isso.uni.edu/orientation

The Study Abroad Center: Exchange students work with both staff in the Study Abroad Center (SAC) and the International Students and Scholars Office (ISSO) while at UNI. The SAC will work with the student prior to arrival and during orientation. Once students are here, the ISSO will be primarily responsible for helping exchange students. The SAC will still be available to answer any questions and arrange activities for the exchange students. APPLICATION & NOMINATION PROCESS

Nomination Deadlines: Exchange students must be nominated by March 1 for the August-December semester and October 1 for the January-May semester in order to allow adequate time for admission process, visa, tickets, etc.

Application Deadlines: Undergraduate exchange students must submit their application materials by April 31 for the August-December semester and October 31 for the January-May semester in order to allow adequate time for admission process, visa, tickets, etc.

Nomination Process: Please send an email with the full name, email, gender, and major/field of study to Stephanie Rojas. Let us know if you would like us to send you the application instructions or send them to the students directly and copy you.

International Student Application Process & Requirements (NOTE: all must be submitted via email to Stephanie Rojas):

- English Proficiency*
- Financial Statement and Certification for International Students
- Request for Permission to Enroll as a Transient (unclassified) Student
- Passport Scan

*English Proficiency: All exchange students who are not native speakers of English must submit proof of English proficiency.

- Undergraduate Exchange Students must submit one of the following:
 - TOEFL 79 (internet based)
 - IELTS-6.0
 - SAT-460 (critical reading)
 - Other alternatives to the TOEFL can be found at intladm.uni.edu/english-proficiency
 - Conditional admission may be considered for undergraduate exchange students who submit a TOEFL with a minimum score of 25 (internet-based) or earn a 2.5 on the IELTS. These students will be tested upon arrival on campus and will be required to enroll in intensive English courses as necessary.
