Exchange Application Steps

Once nominated, an undergraduate exchange student will receive detailed instructions on the application procedure which is outlined below (MBA program and 2+2 application procedure differ):

Send us the completed forms:

- **Application Form**
- Financial Statement and Certification for International Students
- Request for Permission to Enroll as Transient Student
- Passport Scan
- **English Proficiency**

All exchange students who are not native speakers of English must submit proof of English proficiency. Accepted are the following:

- TOEFL-IBT 79
- IELTS -6.0
- Other alternatives to the TOEFL for undergraduate exchange students can be found at intladm.uni.edu/english-proficiency
